**Abstract** The Association was a group of community leaders from towns and cities along the "Old Spanish Trail" from St. Augustine, Florida to San Diego, California. The association formed to promote the development of a motorable highway throughout the South as a spur to local development. The archives of the Association include reports and memoranda, membership books, minutes, correspondence, clippings, brochures, and books published by the Association in pursuit of its objective to facilitate tourism in their locales.

The first conference of the Old Spanish Trail Association was at Mobile, Alabama on December 10-11, 1915 to promote the construction of a southern transcontinental highway to connect New Orleans with the Florida East Coast. The Association was a group of community leaders from towns and cities along the route of the “Old Spanish Trail” (OST) from St. Augustine, Florida to New Orleans. Subsequent annual conferences were Pensacola 1916, Tallahassee 1917, Houston then San Antonio 1919, Gulfport then Orange 1921, and finally New Orleans 1922.

Influence on Highway Construction

The work on the eastern half of the highway began in 1917. The conference in July 1919 at Houston extended the highway westward across Texas and the adjoining states to the west to link five great centers of Spanish missionary activity: San Augustine, San Antonio, El Paso, Tucson and San Diego. At the request of the association the San Antonio members established a headquarters office at the Gunter Hotel (suite 109) and hired Herral Ayers as managing director. The next conference convened in San Antonio in November 1919, appointed councilors in every city and town along the route to advise travelers on conditions and accommodations.

In 1923 the association organized the OST Beautification Committee to provide architectural drawings of highways and bridge signage, county line markers made of native stone, and stone gateways to business and residential districts. From 1923 to 1931 the association published travelogs annually as construction of highway sections and bridges progressed. The association publicized the route to tourists and by August 1926 had distributed 83,000 maps and travel service booklets. By 1929 the highway was completed. A promotional motorcade in April 1929 traveled the route from San Diego to St. Augustine and a return motorcade in October 1929.

“The Texas portion of the road began at the southwestern Louisiana border at Orange, passed through Beaumont, Houston, and San Antonio, and ended at El Paso. It does not follow the route of the Old San Antonio Road, which was sometimes referred to as the “Old Spanish Trail,” which went from Bexar (now San Antonio) east to Nacogdoches and then north to what is now known as the Old Spanish Trail.” (Will Fossey, *Handbook of Texas History*)

“Fredericksburg Road has been one of San Antonio’s major corridors since the 1920s, when it became part of the Old Spanish Trail, a nearly 3,000-mile highway running from St. Augustine, Florida to San Diego, California.” (*San Antonio Express-News*, June 26, 2016:C2)

#### How It Ended

“Efforts are being made to rid the highways of the numerous meaningless road promotions and names substituting numbers only. The people persist in encouraging these promotions; travelers are confused and the public is misled. Eleven years of work to create and build the Old Spanish Trail and give it national prestige will be lost unless our people now cooperate actively to establish forever this historical name for this great highway.” (“Preservation of Old Spanish Trail Name,” OST HQ, June 10, 1926). The Old Spanish Trail after being reduced to a “number” is known to later generations as “US 90.”
