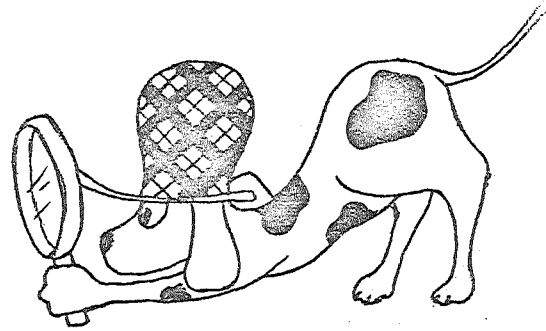

## PLACEMENT SEMINAR SET FOR OCTOBER 11

The Placement Committee has invited several members of the local legal community to speak at a Placement Seminar. The general scope will be the work environment and career pattern of a practicing lawyer in a particular situation. The speakers are representative of the principal forums available for the practice of law. The seminar will be held on Thursday, October 11, at 2:00 p.m. in Rooms 101, 102 and 103 of the Classroom Building. The program includes the following speakers:

Each speaker has been asked to speak for 20 minutes, addressing himself to the following topics: organization of the legal practice; nature of the practice including how time is spent; entry situation and expectations in terms of salary and advancement; and general comments on their situation including why they selected it, the disadvantages and the advantages.

After the presentations you will be invited to seek out the speakers and ask any questions you may have. It is the purpose of the Seminar to give you a clearer picture of the different forums available for the practice of law.

The placement seminar was very successful last year and attracted over 100 law students. The Newsletter Staff joins the Student Coordinating Committee on Placement in urging all St. Mary's law students to attend.

SPORTS NEWS

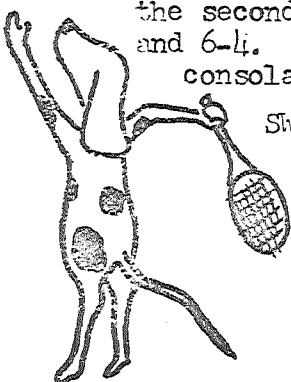
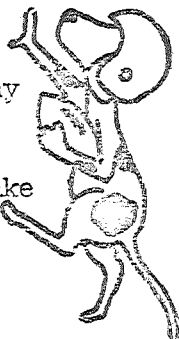

FOOTBALL - Under the guiding hand of player-coach Chris "the Gipper" Frederiksen, the law school football team roared to its second and third straight wins in as many outings. Raba's Raiders rolled up 38 points against Lambda Gamma fraternity in an afternoon game on September 23rd. The Raider defense allowed only 6 points.

In their third game on September 30th, the Raiders crunched Our Lady of the Lake by a score of 34 - 6. When this reporter talked to Coach Frederiksen about his successes and about his expectations of any bowl bids, "the Gipper" merely said he takes the games one at a time and does not worry about the future.

TENNIS - The law school tennis doubles matches were held on September 30th at the McFarlin Tennis Center. Jim Mitchum and Jules Lund won the tournament by besting the second place team of Ty Griesenbeck and Mike Milburn in straight sets, 7-5 and 6-4. Third place went to Chris Frederiksen and Jerry Zwernemann with the consolation prize going to George Taylor and Tom Keyser.

SWIMMING - For the third time in as many years the law school swimming team captured the intramural swim meet taking first place honors in four of the six scheduled events. Under Mike Stiebel's dynamic leadership, individual performances were contributed by Richie Meyers winning 1st in the breast stroke; Robert Anderson taking 1st in the butterfly; the team of Chuck Locke, Jules Lund, Campbell McGuinness and Tom Willess stroking to victory in the freestyle relay; and the team of Stiebel, Meyers, Anderson and Helfers winning the medley relay. Also, contributing to the law school's winning effort were Anderson with a second in the backstroke, followed closely by Stiebel finishing third, and in the freestyle event Helfers took 2nd with McGuinness finishing 3rd.

Delta Theta Phi

In taking office, these members set the goals for Bickett Senate to be a rebirth of growth and development for the student body at St. Mary's.

As a start in this direction, for better working communication with our national office Wayne Hampton attended the bi-annual national conference in Pittsburgh to represent Bickett Senate. Through close work between this senate and the national officers, he was appointed to the office of Deputy District Chancellor for the Southern and Western districts of Texas, the first student dean to hold such a position.

With the fall semester came a practical application of the goals this organization has set for itself. This was the development of an Inter-Organization Council through which better communication between organizations, teachers and students may be had.

The next step in Delta Theta Phi's quest to better serve the students has been shown by their instituting a legal seminar program, the first of which brought you the top men in Texas in the field of Comparative Negligence.

On October 10th, the second in this series of seminars will be sponsored by Delta Theta Phi in the law lecture hall at 7:00 p.m. on Texas' New Penal Code. To explore this new legislation from every side we are bringing three of the members of the Penal Code Revision Committee and one of the top defense attorneys in the city. The panel will consist of Judge Archie Brown, 144th District Court; Judge James Barlow, 186th District Court; James Quinlan, District Attorney's Office; Jack Leon, Defense Attorney; and Professor Joe E. Anderson as Moderator.

There is no admission for this program and we hope every student will take this opportunity to learn of the new developments in this area which will affect us all. For those who have already had Criminal Law, remember this is on the Bar Exam.

In closing, Delta Theta Phi would like to publicly thank the Newsletter staff for the excellent job they have done in making it possible for the student body to stay informed on upcoming events through this newsletter.

#### Phi Alpha Delta

The motto of Phi Alpha Delta is "Service to the Student, to the Law School, and to the Profession," and projects of the Garner Chapter reflect this ideal. For example, profits from the PAD Book Exchange are used to build a scholarship fund and the PAD Housing Newsletter assisted dozens of new students in finding places to live in the vicinity of the law school. One new project of the local membership is a bid for San Antonio and St. Mary's to be the hosts for the 1976 International Convention of Phi Alpha Delta. Other projects of the local and international organizations include a national job placement service open to PAD members.
