Therefore, **neither students nor student organizations** were permitted to approach individual donors to request monetary donations, unless this was **coordinated through the Office of the Dean**. If, however, a student organization approached an individual and/or organization such as HEB for an in-kind contribution of hamburger meat, chips and salsa, such a donation did not have to be coordinated with the Office of the Dean.

Dean Sheppard wishes to maintain this approach, with some process changes. Effectively immediately, all efforts to seek in-kind and monetary contributions will be coordinated through the law school's Office of Advancement. In the near future, Mr. Joel Lauer, Executive Director of the Office of Advancement, will have a form that must be filled out when students and/or student organizations seek an in-kind contribution. This will allow the law school to properly thank those who make in-kind donations, which should increase the likelihood of these individuals and organizations continuing to support our student organizations. Mr. Lauer will also coordinate any and all efforts from students seeking monetary contributions.

### **EMAIL PASSWORD CHANGE**

Security of confidential information is everyone's responsibility. This past summer all employees were required to change their password under a newly approved Password Policy for St. Mary's University. **Effective this Fall 2014 semester, all students are required to change their password** every 180 days. # FEDERAL COURT JUDICIAL INTERNSHIPS IN SAN ANTONIO

### Semesters: Summer 2015, Fall 2015, and Spring 2016 Deadline: Noon Monday, February 23, 2015

Applications are now being accepted for **sixteen pre-graduation judicial internships with five federal judges** who have chambers in San Antonio. This is the only time that applications will be solicited for internships with these courts during the next three semesters. The Honorable Edward C. Prado, a judge on the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit, will offer an internship position to one student during each semester. Interns are required to work 120 hours in chambers, and may earn two pass/fail credits toward graduation. *High academic standing is essential*.

### **The United States District Court**

At the United States District Court for the Western District of Texas, one internship will be available each semester with the Honorable David Ezra and the Honorable Xavier Rodriguez. Interns will assist the judges with a variety of tasks, which may include rulings on motions, preparation of jury charges, and other forms of research and writing related to trial court litigation. Interns may earn two pass/fail credits for 120 hours of work. *Successful candidates typically have a strong academic record*.

### **The United States Magistrate Court**

At the United States Magistrate Court, one internship will be available each semester with the Honorable Pamela Mathy and with the Honorable Henry Bemporad. Interns may earn two pass/fail credits for 120 hours of work. *Successful candidates typically have a strong academic record*.

### **Pass/Fail Credit Limitations**

Students may not count toward graduation more than eight ungraded (pass/fail) elective credit hours earned at St. Mary's.

### **Applications**

Interested students should submit an application to Professor Vincent R. Johnson. Please give your application materials to Ms. Alice Contreras on the second floor of the Raba Law Faculty Building. Questions can be directed to Professor Johnson at <u>vjohnson@stmarytx.edu</u>.

An application should include:

(1) One federal court internship form, available from the Receptionist desk or on the law school website. (The form asks a student to indicate the judges to which the student is applying and the semesters the student is available to serve as an intern.)

(2) For each judge by whom a candidate would like to be considered:

- One resume, including cumulative GPA and current class rank;
- One cover letter in business-letter format (return address, date, judge's address, proper salutation (*e.g.*, Dear Judge Prado), and signature. In terms of tone, the letter should be restrained, professional, factual, interesting, and confident;
- Please staple the cover letter to the front of the resume. Please do not use special folders or bindings; they will be removed before the applications are sent to the judges.

Writing samples should not be included.

*Eligibility of Full-Time and Part-Time Students*: Students may apply for any internship that will commence in a semester after the student has completed 30 hours of course work. Thus, a first-year full-time student may apply for an internship that will take place in the summer between first and second year, or during any subsequent semester. A first-year part-time student may apply for a judicial internship that commences in the spring of the student's second-year or later.

#### **COURT OF CRIMINAL APPEALS INTERNSHIP**

A summer internship with the Staff Attorneys' Office at the Court of Criminal Appeals in Austin, Texas is available for a limited number of students during the summer of 2015. Students who are selected for the program will work under the supervision of staff attorneys on criminal appeals, petitions for discretionary review and habeas corpus petitions. Those interested in applying should send a resume and a cover letter addressed to Professor Schmolesky in Room 224 of the Law Faculty Building. In the letter please indicate if you have any preference for first or second summer session. Students will receive two pass/fail credits upon successful completion of the program, which requires a minimum of 120 hours of work. Students will receive credit as if for a course offered on the home campus rather than transient credit, and accepted students will be required to pay tuition to the Law School for their participation in the program. Preference will be given to students who have completed two years of law school, but students who have completed their first year may apply. The deadline for applications is 12:00 p.m. on Friday, March 20, 2015. #### EAP MOOT COURT TEAM IS NATIONAL CHAMPION AT FBA COMPETITION

This weekend, members of the St. Mary's EAP Moot Court Team traveled to Washington, DC for the Federal Bar Association's Eighteenth Annual Thurgood A. Marshall Moot Court Competition, recognized as one of the premiere moot court competitions in the nation. The competition attracts teams from law schools across the country, and deals primarily with trending constitutional questions. St. Mary's fielded 3 of the 38 teams competing at this prestigious tournament: (1) Stephen Bachran (3L) and Bianca Frisaura (3L); (2) Stephanie De Sola (2L) and Leah Wise (2L); and (3) Dylan Pearcy (2L) and Olivero Flores (2L). All three St. Mary's teams advanced to the Quarter-Finals — an incredible feat and believed to be the first time in the competition's eighteen year history that a competing law school was able to place 3 of the top 8 teams at the tournament. But St. Mary's mooters did not stop there. In fact, no other law school was able to beat St. Mary's - Bachran / Frisaura defeated De Sola / Wise in the Quarter-Final round and Bachran / Frisaura defeated Pearcy / Flores in an all St. Mary's Championship Round, which took place at the historic United States Court of Appeals for the Armed Forces. Along the way, St. Mary's students racked up oral and brief awards as well: Stephen Bachran was recognized as the third-best advocate (out of 76 competitors) in the preliminary rounds of the competition, the team of Stephanie De Sola and Leah Wise won second-best brief, and Dylan Pearcy took home best advocate in the Finals. This is the second year in a row that Stephen Bachran has represented St. Mary's in the Championship round, with his team bringing the FBA Champion's Cup home to St. Mary's both times. St. Mary's has now won this national competition three out of the last four years.
