Below is a bio of Professor Grenardo.

Upon graduation from Rice University and Duke University School of Law, Professor Grenardo practiced law in California and Texas for three major law firms (Jones Day, DLA Piper, and King & Spalding) for nearly a decade before joining the legal academy with Ave Maria School of Law in Naples, Florida. During his practice, he represented clients, ranging from Fortune 100 companies to small businesses and individuals, in a wide variety of complex commercial litigation matters, including contract, tort, product liability, insurance law, franchise and copyright cases. He has extensive pretrial and trial experience, which includes discovery, depositions, motion practice and negotiating settlements. He has argued before state and federal

trial courts, bankruptcy court and the court of appeals. He has tried cases before a jury, arbitrators and an administrate law judge. Professor Grenardo dedicated a significant part of his practice to pro bono work, which included protecting the rights of, among others, domestic violence victims, the developmentally disabled and First Amendment litigants. He has received numerous awards for his pro bono efforts, including the Frank J. Scurlock Award, which is one of the highest individual pro bono honors awarded by the State Bar of Texas, the Harriet Buhai Center for Family Law Pro Bono Panel Volunteer of the Year, the Wiley W. Manuel Award bestowed by the State Bar of California, the San Diego Volunteer Lawyer Program Distinguished Service Award, and Texas Civil Rights Project Pro Bono Champion.

This fall he joined the faculty of St. Mary's University School of Law in San Antonio as an Assistant Professor of Law. He teaches Professional Responsibility, Business Associations, Contracts, and Civil Procedure.

He has presented on ethics several times on a national level for the American Bar Association ("ABA"), and he has also presented locally on ethics. For example, this past summer he led a panel at the ABA's 39th National Conference on Professional Responsibility. His previous articles have been published in Cardozo's Public Law, Policy & Ethics Journal, the University of North Carolina Law School's First Amendment Law Review, and he has had several articles published by the ABA.

Professor Grenardo grew up in Colorado and played football at Rice University. He and his wife, Dr. Jennifer Grenardo, Ed.D., have two boys, Solomon (4) and Moses (2).

Deadline to waive the Student Health Insurance is **September 5, 2013**. There are no extensions to this deadline. F1 international students are <u>NOT</u> allowed to waive the Student Health Insurance for any reason.

International Intellectual Property Law (2 credit hours, Professors Robert Hu and Sun Xinqiang) discusses the licensing and protection of intellectual property against the larger backdrop of international trade and commerce, with particular reference to intellectual property rules applicable in the United States and China.

Introduction to Chinese Law (1 credit hour, Professor Chenglin Liu) introduces students to the history and institutions of the Chinese legal system, including the governmental structure, legislative process, court system, sources of law and enforcement mechanisms. It also explores the important substantive areas of the law, such as the rules governing property ownership.

LONE STAR CLASSIC - CALL FOR BAILIFFS & MARSHALS

Both the semi-final and final rounds will be held on campus, at St. Mary's University School of Law. Additionally, the final round will take place in St. Mary's state-of-the-art courtroom.

For those of you interested in advocacy, joining a mock trial team, or just want to see what these competitions are all about, this is an excellent opportunity to witness some of the best mock trial teams in the nation compete. We look forward to hearing from you soon.

The law school's **study abroad program in China** will be offered **May 26 to June 28, 2014**. All students are invited to attend an information meeting with the program directors, Professors Bob Hu and Vincent Johnson. Next year's program will offer three courses (5 credits), conduct field trips to visit Chinese law and government institutions, and arrange for internships with Chinese law firms and American/Chinese companies. The courses will include the following:

International Business Transactions and China (2 credit hours, Professor Vincent R. Johnson) explores the Convention on the International Sale of Goods and other laws relevant to business relationships between American and Chinese entities. Topics include import-export transactions, sales in China through distributors and franchisees, and direct foreign investment

in China (joint ventures and wholly foreign owned enterprises).

International Intellectual Property Law (2 credit hours, Professors Robert Hu and Sun Xinqiang) discusses the licensing and protection of intellectual property against the larger backdrop of international trade and commerce, with particular reference to intellectual property rules applicable in the United States and China.

Introduction to Chinese Law (1 credit hour, Professor Chenglin Liu) introduces students to the history and institutions of the Chinese legal system, including the governmental structure, legislative process, court system, sources of law and enforcement mechanisms. It also explores the important substantive areas of the law, such as the rules governing property ownership.

LONE STAR CLASSIC - CALL FOR BAILIFFS & MARSHALS

The law school will be conducting the **2013 Lone Star Classic**® on **October 17–19**, **2013** in San Antonio. The competition is open to all law schools that have been accredited by the American Bar Association. We anticipate having 16 teams compete.

This year the problem will be a criminal case in the State of Lone Star, a hypothetical venue, and it will utilize the Federal Rules of Evidence.

If you are **interested in serving as a bailiff or marshal for the preliminary rounds**, please stop by the Board of Advocates (BOA) office or contact Mr. Brandon Cook for an entry form. Notably, students serving in one of these capacities will receive 2 BOA points for each round in which they serve—enabling those seeking to join BOA in the future to meet the required participation points set out by the organization.

The **preliminary rounds** will take place on Thursday and Friday, October 17th and 18th, in the Bexar County Courthouse, Probate Court 2. The teams will break to **semi-final rounds** on the morning of Saturday, October 19th. The **final round** will take place on that same day, the afternoon of the 19th. Both the semi-final and final rounds will be held on campus, at St. Mary's University School of Law. Additionally, the final round will take place in St. Mary's state-of-the-art courtroom.

For those of you interested in advocacy, joining a mock trial team, or just want to see what these competitions are all about, this is an excellent opportunity to witness some of the best mock trial teams in the nation compete. We look forward to hearing from you soon.

St. Mary's School of Law Pro Bono and Public Service Certificate Requirements

- 1. 50 hours of combined pro bono and/or community service hours completed over the 3-5 years of study, while enrolled as a law student (full time or part time).
- 2. Recorded on a tracking form that is approved or provided by The Pro Bono Program. And signed by a supervisor or authorized signer for the event(s).

Requirements for Admission into the Pro Bono College:

- 1. Be a student enrolled in a Texas law school and be in good academic standing;
- 2. Complete at least 50 hours of pro bono work per year (September 1 August 31); and
- 3. Complete an application documenting all hours performed.

Pro Bono College Work Defined

- 1. The services must be law-related and be provided free of any charge to:
 - a. A person who qualifies as indigent under the federal poverty income guidelines;
 - b. Charitable, public interest organizations with respect to matters or projects designed predominantly to address the needs of poor persons; or
 - c. The State Bar or any other body or organization in furtherance of the rights of indigent persons.
- 2. With the exception of travel time, any time spent working on the pro bono projects counts, including training sessions and research for the project.
- 3. Pro bono work does <u>not</u> qualify if it:
 - a. Resulted in monetary compensation to the student above and beyond reimbursement for expenses incurred in the delivery of pro bono services;
 - b. Was performed as part of a course or other activity for which the student received any academic credit; or
 - c. Was performed in connection with fundraising activities.

Benefits of Pro Bono College Membership

The law school's **study abroad program in China** will be offered **May 26 to June 28, 2014**. All students are invited to attend an information meeting with the program directors, Professors Bob Hu and Vincent Johnson. Next year's program will offer three courses (5 credits), conduct field trips to visit Chinese law and government institutions, and arrange for internships with Chinese law firms and American/Chinese companies. The courses will include the following:

International Business Transactions and China (2 credit hours, Professor Vincent R. Johnson) explores the Convention on the International Sale of Goods and other laws relevant to business relationships between American and Chinese entities. Topics include import-export transactions, sales in China through distributors and franchisees, and direct foreign investment in China (joint ventures and wholly foreign owned enterprises).

International Intellectual Property Law (2 credit hours, Professors Robert Hu and Sun Xinqiang) discusses the licensing and protection of intellectual property against the larger backdrop of international trade and commerce, with particular reference to intellectual property rules applicable in the United States and China.

Introduction to Chinese Law (1 credit hour, Professor Chenglin Liu) introduces students to the history and institutions of the Chinese legal system, including the governmental structure, legislative process, court system, sources of law and enforcement mechanisms. It also explores the important substantive areas of the law, such as the rules governing property ownership.

St. Mary's School of Law Pro Bono and Public Service Certificate Requirements

- 1. 50 hours of combined pro bono and/or community service hours completed over the 3-5 years of study, while enrolled as a law student (full time or part time).
- 2. Recorded on a tracking form that is approved or provided by The Pro Bono Program. And signed by a supervisor or authorized signer for the event(s).

Requirements for Admission into the Pro Bono College:

- 1. Be a student enrolled in a Texas law school and be in good academic standing;
- 2. Complete at least 50 hours of pro bono work per year (September 1 August 31); and
- 3. Complete an application documenting all hours performed.

Pro Bono College Work Defined

- 1. The services must be law-related and be provided free of any charge to:
 - a. A person who qualifies as indigent under the federal poverty income guidelines;
 - b. Charitable, public interest organizations with respect to matters or projects designed predominantly to address the needs of poor persons; or
 - c. The State Bar or any other body or organization in furtherance of the rights of indigent persons.
- 2. With the exception of travel time, any time spent working on the pro bono projects counts, including training sessions and research for the project.
- 3. Pro bono work does not qualify if it:
 - a. Resulted in monetary compensation to the student above and beyond reimbursement for expenses incurred in the delivery of pro bono services;
 - b. Was performed as part of a course or other activity for which the student received any academic credit; or
 - c. Was performed in connection with fundraising activities.

The **Contract Drafting** course will teach students the principles of contemporary commercial drafting and introduce them to documents typically used in a variety of transactions. The skills students will gain will be applicable to any transactional practice and will even be useful to litigators. On finishing the course, students should know: the business purpose of each of the contract concepts; how to translate the business deal into contract concepts; how to draft each of a contract's parts; how to draft with clarity and without ambiguity; how to add value to a deal; how to work through the drafting process; and how to review and comment on a contract. Students will perform drafting and contract negotiation exercises throughout the semester, and course grades will be based on several drafting exercises and class participation.

2) The Practice Credit Program

The Practice Credit Program (3 credit hour program only) offers students the opportunity to earn course credit while performing a legal externship.  - a. Resulted in monetary compensation to the student above and beyond reimbursement for expenses incurred in the delivery of pro bono services;

- c. Was performed in connection with fundraising activities.

PRACTICE SKILLS REQUIREMENTS AVAILABLE SPRING 2014

St. Mary's now offers two additional ways to meet student practice skills requirement for graduation. Both avenues are available to students in Spring 2014.

1) Contract Drafting with Professor Walch

The **Contract Drafting** course will teach students the principles of contemporary commercial drafting and introduce them to documents typically used in a variety of transactions. The skills students will gain will be applicable to any transactional practice and will even be useful to litigators. On finishing the course, students should know: the business purpose of each of the contract concepts; how to translate the business deal into contract concepts; how to draft each of a contract's parts; how to draft with clarity and without ambiguity; how to add value to a deal; how to work through the drafting process; and how to review and comment on a contract. Students will perform drafting and contract negotiation exercises throughout the semester, and course grades will be based on several drafting exercises and class participation.

2) The Practice Credit Program

The Practice Credit Program (3 credit hour program only) offers students the opportunity to earn course credit while performing a legal externship. Now in its 55th year, the Philip C. Jessup International Law Moot Court Competition is the world's largest moot court competition, with participants from over 550 law schools in more than 80 countries. The Competition is a simulation of a fictional dispute between countries before the International Court of Justice, the judicial organ of the United Nations. One team is allowed to participate from every eligible school. Teams prepare oral and written pleadings arguing both the applicant and respondent positions of the case. Thousands of law students from around the world will work all year long on this season's Jessup Problem, which addresses maritime development and conservation, criminal jurisdiction and maritime salvage rights. Most students must first compete in qualifying competitions (mostly held in January-March) to earn the right to advance to the White & Case International Rounds held every spring in Washington, D.C.

PRACTICE SKILLS REQUIREMENTS AVAILABLE SPRING 2014

The **Contract Drafting** course will teach students the principles of contemporary commercial drafting and introduce them to documents typically used in a variety of transactions. Most students must first compete in qualifying competitions (mostly held in January-March) to earn the right to advance to the White & Case International Rounds held every spring in Washington, D.C.

PRACTICE SKILLS REQUIREMENTS AVAILABLE SPRING 2014

St. Mary's now offers two additional ways to meet student practice skills requirement for graduation. Both avenues are available to students in Spring 2014.

1) Contract Drafting with Professor Walch

The **Contract Drafting** course will teach students the principles of contemporary commercial drafting and introduce them to documents typically used in a variety of transactions. The skills students will gain will be applicable to any transactional practice and will even be useful to litigators. On finishing the course, students should know: the business purpose of each of the

contract concepts; how to translate the business deal into contract concepts; how to draft each of a contract's parts; how to draft with clarity and without ambiguity; how to add value to a deal; how to work through the drafting process; and how to review and comment on a contract. Students will perform drafting and contract negotiation exercises throughout the semester, and course grades will be based on several drafting exercises and class participation.

2) The Practice Credit Program

The Practice Credit Program (3 credit hour Externship program only) offers students the opportunity to earn course credit while performing a legal externship. CLASS OF 2015 STUDENTS Applying to a Federal Clerkship

The **Office of Career Services** has received information that OSCAR is being opened to all 2Ls effective **November 4, 2013**. This means that you can go on the site (https://oscar.uscourts.gov) and see judges that are hiring for your class and apply to them through OSCAR or their preferred method of receipt. If you are interested in pursuing a federal clerkship after graduation we are here and ready to work with you to get your applications completed.

Below is a list of things you should **begin doing to prepare** for the process:

- 1) Review the court websites for all courts you are interested in applying to and create an excel spreadsheet that includes the names of the judges and the courts you are interested in. You can do this by Googling the court; go to their website and look up their list of judges.
- 2) Once you have created a list, meet with Alicia to discuss a timeline. She may be able to reach out to the courts and find out when the judges are hiring. Note: Alicia will be calling all state and federal judges in the state of Texas and we will post their hiring timelines as an announcement in Symplicity as we get the information.
- 3) Start seeking out recommenders as you will need 2-3 and they are usually law school professors. Ask the recommenders to send their letters to Alicia at amendoza1@stmarytx.edu in Word format so she can upload them to OSCAR and have them printed for hard copy applications.
- 4) Most of this can be done after finals and we strongly recommend you make an appointment with our office to go over your game plan if you plan to apply to judges.

The Administrative Office of the United States Courts and the OSCAR Working Group would like to thank the National Association for Law Placement (NALP) Judicial Clerkship Section and its law school members for providing informative feedback on the 2013 clerkship season. The OSCAR Working Group of judges and law school representatives recently met and, after careful consideration, recommended de-linking OSCAR from the Federal Law Clerk Hiring Plan (Hiring Plan). The first step is to allow second-year law school students ("2Ls") access to OSCAR as soon as possible. In response, the Administrative Office has opened OSCAR to "2Ls" effective today (November 4, 2013), and OSCAR will release their applications when finalized rather than holding them until a specified release date.

As part of de-linking OSCAR from the Hiring Plan, the OSCAR Working Group will further consider providing first-year law school students ("1Ls") access to OSCAR at its annual meeting in November. I will provide further information on the outcome of this deliberation after the meeting.

A transparent and fair recruitment process is important to the Administrative Office and the OSCAR Working Group. The Administrative Office Director, Judge John D. Bates, sent a communication today to all federal judges informing them that "2Ls" have access to OSCAR and their applications will be available online at the time of submission. The communication encouraged all judges to use OSCAR to accept applications online, post their positions, and maintain a current judge profile that communicates their hiring preferences.

PRACTICE SKILLS REQUIREMENTS AVAILABLE SPRING 2014

St. Mary's now offers two additional ways to meet student practice skills requirement for graduation. Both avenues are available to students in Spring 2014.

1) Contract Drafting with Professor Walch

The **Contract Drafting** course will teach students the principles of contemporary commercial drafting and introduce them to documents typically used in a variety of transactions. The skills students will gain will be applicable to any transactional practice and will even be useful to litigators. - 3) Start seeking out recommenders as you will need 2-3 and they are usually law school professors. Ask the recommenders to send their letters to Alicia at amendoza1@stmarytx.edu in Word format. She will upload them to OSCAR and will print them for hard copy applications.
- 4) Most of this can be done after finals and we strongly recommend you make an appointment with OCS to review your game plan if you plan to apply to judges.

"The Administrative Office of the United States Courts and the OSCAR Working Group would like to thank the National Association for Law Placement (NALP) Judicial Clerkship Section and its law school members for providing informative feedback on the 2013 clerkship season. The OSCAR Working Group of judges and law school representatives recently met and, after careful consideration, recommended de-linking OSCAR from the Federal Law Clerk Hiring Plan (Hiring Plan). The first step is to allow second-year law school students ("2Ls") access to OSCAR as soon as possible. In response, the Administrative Office has opened OSCAR to "2Ls" effective today (November 4, 2013), and OSCAR will release their applications when finalized rather than holding them until a specified release date.

As part of de-linking OSCAR from the Hiring Plan, the OSCAR Working Group will further consider providing first-year law school students ("1Ls") access to OSCAR at its annual meeting in November. I will provide further information on the outcome of this deliberation after the meeting.

A transparent and fair recruitment process is important to the Administrative Office and the OSCAR Working Group. The Administrative Office Director, Judge John D. Bates, sent a communication today to all federal judges informing them that "2Ls" have access to OSCAR and their applications will be available online at the time of submission. The communication encouraged all judges to use OSCAR to accept applications online, post their positions, and maintain a current judge profile that communicates their hiring preferences."

PRACTICE SKILLS REQUIREMENTS AVAILABLE SPRING 2014

St. Mary's now offers two additional ways to meet student practice skills requirement for graduation. Both avenues are available to students in Spring 2014.

1) Contract Drafting with Professor Walch

The Contract Drafting course will teach students the principles of contemporary commercial

drafting and introduce them to documents typically used in a variety of transactions. The skills students will gain will be applicable to any transactional practice and will even be useful to litigators. On finishing the course, students should know: the business purpose of each of the contract concepts; how to translate the business deal into contract concepts; how to draft each of a contract's parts; how to draft with clarity and without ambiguity; how to add value to a deal; how to work through the drafting process; and how to review and comment on a contract. Students will perform drafting and contract negotiation exercises throughout the semester, and course grades will be based on several drafting exercises and class participation.

2) The Practice Credit Program: Externship

The PCP Externship course for three credit hours will now meet the practice skills requirement. The PCP Externship course offers students the opportunity to earn three academic credits while performing a legal externship for a minimum of 180 hours at a non-profit, government, and select general counsel's offices (NEW ADDITION). If you are interested in pursuing a federal clerkship after graduation OCS is here and ready to work with you to get your applications completed.

Below is a list of things **you should begin doing** to prepare for this process:

- 1) Review the court websites for all courts you are interested in applying to and create an excel spreadsheet that includes the names of the judges and the courts you are interested in. You can do this by Googling the court; go to their website and look up their list of judges.
- 2) Once you have created a list, meet with Alicia to discuss a timeline. She may be able to reach out to the courts and find out when the judges are hiring. Note: Alicia will be calling all state and federal judges in the state of Texas and will post their hiring timelines as an announcement in Symplicity as we get the information.
- 3) Start seeking out recommenders as you will need 2-3 and they are usually law school professors. Ask the recommenders to send their letters to Alicia at amendoza1@stmarytx.edu in Word format. She will upload them to OSCAR and will print them for hard copy applications.
- 4) Most of this can be done after finals and we strongly recommend you make an appointment with OCS to review your game plan if you plan to apply to judges.

"The Administrative Office of the United States Courts and the OSCAR Working Group would like to thank the National Association for Law Placement (NALP) Judicial Clerkship Section and its law school members for providing informative feedback on the 2013 clerkship season. The OSCAR Working Group of judges and law school representatives recently met and, after careful consideration, recommended de-linking OSCAR from the Federal Law Clerk Hiring Plan (Hiring Plan). The first step is to allow second-year law school students ("2Ls") access to OSCAR as soon as possible. In response, the Administrative Office has opened OSCAR to "2Ls" effective today (November 4, 2013), and OSCAR will release their applications when finalized rather than holding them until a specified release date.

As part of de-linking OSCAR from the Hiring Plan, the OSCAR Working Group will further consider providing first-year law school students ("1Ls") access to OSCAR at its annual meeting in November. I will provide further information on the outcome of this deliberation after the meeting.

A transparent and fair recruitment process is important to the Administrative Office and the OSCAR Working Group. The Administrative Office Director, Judge John D. Bates, sent a communication today to all federal judges informing them that "2Ls" have access to OSCAR and their applications will be available online at the time of submission. The communication encouraged all judges to use OSCAR to accept applications online, post their positions, and maintain a current judge profile that communicates their hiring preferences."

PRACTICE SKILLS REQUIREMENTS AVAILABLE SPRING 2014

St. Mary's now offers two additional ways to meet student practice skills requirement for graduation. Both avenues are available to students in Spring 2014.

1) Contract Drafting with Professor Walch

The **Contract Drafting** course will teach students the principles of contemporary commercial drafting and introduce them to documents typically used in a variety of transactions. The skills students will gain will be applicable to any transactional practice and will even be useful to litigators. On finishing the course, students should know: the business purpose of each of the contract concepts; how to translate the business deal into contract concepts; how to draft each of a contract's parts; how to draft with clarity and without ambiguity; how to add value to a deal; how to work through the drafting process; and how to review and comment on a contract. Students will perform drafting and contract negotiation exercises throughout the semester, and course grades will be based on several drafting exercises and class participation.

2) The Practice Credit Program: Externship

The PCP Externship course for three credit hours will now meet the practice skills requirement. The PCP Externship course offers students the opportunity to earn three academic credits while performing a legal externship for a minimum of 180 hours at a non-profit, government, and select general counsel's offices (NEW ADDITION). Please visit the site at https://oscar.uscourts.gov and see judges that are hiring for your class and apply to them through OSCAR or their preferred method of receipt. If you are interested in pursuing a federal clerkship after graduation OCS is here and ready to work with you to get your applications completed.

Below is a list of things **you should begin doing** to prepare for this process:

1) Review the court websites for all courts you are interested in applying to and create an excel spreadsheet that includes the names of the judges and the courts

you are interested in. You can do this by Googling the court; go to their website and look up their list of judges.

- 2) Once you have created a list, meet with Alicia to discuss a timeline. She may be able to reach out to the courts and find out when the judges are hiring. Note: Alicia will be calling all state and federal judges in the state of Texas and will post their hiring timelines as an announcement in Symplicity as we get the information.
- 3) Start seeking out recommenders as you will need 2-3 and they are usually law school professors. Ask the recommenders to send their letters to Alicia at amendoza1@stmarytx.edu in Word format. She will upload them to OSCAR and will print them for hard copy applications.
- 4) Most of this can be done after finals and we strongly recommend you make an appointment with OCS to review your game plan if you plan to apply to judges.

"The Administrative Office of the United States Courts and the OSCAR Working Group would like to thank the National Association for Law Placement (NALP) Judicial Clerkship Section and its law school members for providing informative feedback on the 2013 clerkship season. The OSCAR Working Group of judges and law school representatives recently met and, after careful consideration, recommended de-linking OSCAR from the Federal Law Clerk Hiring Plan (Hiring Plan). The first step is to allow second-year law school students ("2Ls") access to OSCAR as soon as possible. In response, the Administrative Office has opened OSCAR to "2Ls" effective today (November 4, 2013), and OSCAR will release their applications when finalized rather than holding them until a specified release date.

As part of de-linking OSCAR from the Hiring Plan, the OSCAR Working Group will further consider providing first-year law school students ("1Ls") access to OSCAR at its annual meeting in November. I will provide further information on the outcome of this deliberation after the meeting.

A transparent and fair recruitment process is important to the Administrative Office and the OSCAR Working Group. The Administrative Office Director, Judge John D. Bates, sent a communication today to all federal judges informing them that "2Ls" have access to OSCAR and their applications will be available online at the time of submission. The communication encouraged all judges to use OSCAR to accept applications online, post their positions, and maintain a current judge profile that communicates their hiring preferences."

PRACTICE SKILLS REQUIREMENTS AVAILABLE SPRING 2014

St. Mary's now offers two additional ways to meet student practice skills requirement for graduation. Both avenues are available to students in Spring 2014.

1) Contract Drafting with Professor Walch

The **Contract Drafting** course will teach students the principles of contemporary commercial drafting and introduce them to documents typically used in a variety of transactions. If you are interested in pursuing a federal clerkship after graduation OCS is here and ready to work with you to get your applications completed.

Below is a list of things you should begin doing to prepare for this process:

1) Review the court websites for all courts you are interested in applying to and create an excel spreadsheet that includes the names of the judges and the courts

you are interested in. You can do this by Googling the court; go to their website and look up their list of judges.

- 2) Once you have created a list, meet with Alicia to discuss a timeline. She may be able to reach out to the courts and find out when the judges are hiring. Note: Alicia will be calling all state and federal judges in the state of Texas and will post their hiring timelines as an announcement in Symplicity as we get the information.
- 3) Start seeking out recommenders as you will need 2-3 and they are usually law school professors. Ask the recommenders to send their letters to Alicia at amendoza1@stmarytx.edu in Word format. She will upload them to OSCAR and will print them for hard copy applications.
- 4) Most of this can be done after finals and we strongly recommend you make an appointment with OCS to review your game plan if you plan to apply to judges.

"The Administrative Office of the United States Courts and the OSCAR Working Group would like to thank the National Association for Law Placement (NALP) Judicial Clerkship Section and its law school members for providing informative feedback on the 2013 clerkship season. The OSCAR Working Group of judges and law school representatives recently met and, after careful consideration, recommended de-linking OSCAR from the Federal Law Clerk Hiring Plan (Hiring Plan). The first step is to allow second-year law school students ("2Ls") access to OSCAR as soon as possible. In response, the Administrative Office has opened OSCAR to "2Ls" effective today (November 4, 2013), and OSCAR will release their applications when finalized rather than holding them until a specified release date.

As part of de-linking OSCAR from the Hiring Plan, the OSCAR Working Group will further consider providing first-year law school students ("1Ls") access to OSCAR at its annual meeting in November. I will provide further information on the outcome of this deliberation after the meeting.

A transparent and fair recruitment process is important to the Administrative Office and the OSCAR Working Group. The Administrative Office Director, Judge John D. Bates, sent a communication today to all federal judges informing them that "2Ls" have access to OSCAR and their applications will be available online at the time of submission. The communication encouraged all judges to use OSCAR to accept applications online, post their positions, and maintain a current judge profile that communicates their hiring preferences."

PRACTICE SKILLS REQUIREMENTS AVAILABLE SPRING 2014

St. Mary's now offers two additional ways to meet student practice skills requirement for graduation. Both avenues are available to students in Spring 2014.

1) Contract Drafting with Professor Walch

The **Contract Drafting** course will teach students the principles of contemporary commercial drafting and introduce them to documents typically used in a variety of transactions. Workshop: Topic Selection for Seminar Papers

Date: February 5, 2014 (Wednesday) Location: Law Library, Room 106

You've selected a class that sounded interesting. A few days into it and you realize your grade is based on a scholarly paper due at the end of the semester. CLASS OF 2015 STUDENTS APPLYING TO A FEDERAL CLERKSHIP

The **Office of Career Services** (OCS) has received information that OSCAR is now open to all 2Ls. Please visit the site at https://oscar.uscourts.gov and see judges that are hiring for your class and apply to them through OSCAR or their preferred method of receipt. If you are interested in pursuing a federal clerkship after graduation OCS is here and ready to work with you to get your applications completed.

Below is a list of things **you should begin doing** to prepare for this process:

- 1) Review the court websites for all courts you are interested in applying to and create an excel spreadsheet that includes the names of the judges and the courts you are interested in. You can do this by Googling the court; go to their website and look up their list of judges.
- 2) Once you have created a list, meet with Alicia to discuss a timeline. She may be able to reach out to the courts and find out when the judges are hiring. Note: Alicia will be calling all state and federal judges in the state of Texas and will post their hiring timelines as an announcement in Symplicity as we get the information.
- 3) Start seeking out recommenders as you will need 2-3 and they are usually law school professors. Ask the recommenders to send their letters to Alicia at amendoza1@stmarytx.edu in Word format. She will upload them to OSCAR and will print them for hard copy applications.
- 4) Most of this can be done after finals and we strongly recommend you make an appointment with OCS to review your game plan if you plan to apply to judges.

"The Administrative Office of the United States Courts and the OSCAR Working Group would like to thank the National Association for Law Placement (NALP) Judicial Clerkship Section and its law school members for providing informative feedback on the 2013 clerkship season. The OSCAR Working Group of judges and law school representatives recently met and, after careful consideration, recommended de-linking OSCAR from the Federal Law Clerk Hiring Plan (Hiring Plan). The first step is to allow second-year law school students ("2Ls") access to OSCAR as soon as possible. In response, the Administrative Office has opened OSCAR to "2Ls" effective today (November 4, 2013), and OSCAR will release their applications when finalized rather than holding them until a specified release date.

As part of de-linking OSCAR from the Hiring Plan, the OSCAR Working Group will further consider providing first-year law school students ("1Ls") access to OSCAR at its annual meeting in November. I will provide further information on the outcome of this deliberation after the meeting.

A transparent and fair recruitment process is important to the Administrative Office and the OSCAR Working Group. The Administrative Office Director, Judge John D. Bates, sent a communication today to all federal judges informing them that "2Ls" have access to OSCAR and their applications will be available online at the time of submission. The communication encouraged all judges to use OSCAR to accept applications online, post their positions, and maintain a current judge profile that communicates their hiring preferences."

- 1) Review the court websites for all courts you are interested in applying to and create an excel spreadsheet that includes the names of the judges and the courts you are interested in. You can do this by Googling the court; go to their website and look up their list of judges.
- 2) Once you have created a list, meet with Alicia to discuss a timeline. She may be able to reach out to the courts and find out when the judges are hiring. Note: Alicia will be calling all state and federal judges in the state of Texas and will

post their hiring timelines as an announcement in Symplicity as we get the information.

- 3) Start seeking out recommenders as you will need 2-3 and they are usually law school professors. Ask the recommenders to send their letters to Alicia at amendoza1@stmarytx.edu in Word format. She will upload them to OSCAR and will print them for hard copy applications.
- 4) Most of this can be done after finals and we strongly recommend you make an appointment with OCS to review your game plan if you plan to apply to judges.

- 3) Start seeking out recommenders as you will need 2-3 and they are usually law school professors. Ask the recommenders to send their letters to Alicia at amendoza1@stmarytx.edu in Word format. She will upload them to OSCAR and will print them for hard copy applications.
- 4) We strongly recommend you make an appointment with OCS to review your game plan if you plan to apply to judges.

- 1) Review the court websites for all courts you are interested in applying to and create an excel spreadsheet that includes the names of the judges and the courts you are interested in. You can do this by Googling the court; go to their website and look up their list of judges.
- 2) Once you have created a list, meet with Alicia to discuss a timeline. She may be able to reach out to the courts and find out when the judges are hiring. Note: Alicia will be calling all state and federal judges in the state of Texas and will post their hiring timelines as an announcement in Symplicity as we get the information.
- 3) Start seeking out recommenders as you will need 2-3 and they are usually law school professors. Ask the recommenders to send their letters to Alicia at

- <u>amendoza1@stmarytx.edu</u> in Word format. She will upload them to OSCAR and will print them for hard copy applications.
- 4) We strongly recommend you make an appointment with OCS to review your game plan if you plan to apply to judges.

We are still in the process of calling all Federal judges in Texas but many of them have updated their OSCAR profiles with their hiring needs.

- 1) Review the court websites for all courts you are interested in applying to and create an excel spreadsheet that includes the names of the judges and the courts you are interested in. You can do this by Googling the court; go to their website and look up their list of judges.
- 2) Once you have created a list, meet with Alicia to discuss a timeline. She may be able to reach out to the courts and find out when the judges are hiring.
- 3) Start seeking out recommenders as you will need 2-3 and they are usually law school professors. Ask the recommenders to send their letters to Alicia at amendoza1@stmarytx.edu in Word format. She will upload them to OSCAR and will print them for hard copy applications.
- 4) We strongly recommend you make an appointment with OCS to review your game plan if you plan to apply to judges.

FOURTH COURT OF APPEALS TO HEAR ORAL ARGUMENTS

The **Fourth Court of Appeals** will hear oral arguments in two appeals on **Tuesday, March 18, 2014**, at St. Mary's Law School beginning at 9:30 a.m.

The first case, 04-13-00386-CR *Deshawn Ondrey Williams v. The State of Texas*, will be heard before the following panel of justices: Justice Karen Angelini, Justice Patricia Alvarez and Justice Luz Elena D. Chapa. Appellant Deshawn Ondrey Williams was found guilty by a jury for the offense of terroristic threats against a public servant. In his first issue on appeal, Williams argues the evidence is legally insufficient to prove that the alleged threat was made with the specific intent to place the witness in fear of *imminent* serious bodily injury or death. More specifically, Williams argues that even assuming the alleged facts were accurate, the alleged threat was for an event to occur the following week and, therefore, the threat could not have been imminent. In his second issue, Williams contends that because he was indigent, the trial court erroneously ordered Williams to pay attorneys' fees.

The second case, 04-13-00326-CR *Benny Alonzo v. The State of Texas*, will begin at 10:30 a.m. and be heard by the panel of: Chief Justice Catherine Stone, Justice Sandee Bryan Marion, and Justice Rebeca C. Martinez. Appellant, Benny Alonzo, appeals his conviction for unlawful possession of a firearm by a felon. In two issues on appeal, appellant asserts (1) the trial court erred in denying his motion to suppress, and (2) the evidence is legally insufficient to support his conviction.

An afternoon reception will follow in the Alumni Room at 12:00 p.m. for presentation of the *Alma Lopez "Women in Law" Leadership Award* and the inaugural *Catherine M. Stone "Rock of Justice" Award* in honor of Justice Stone's retirement from the bench. All students, faculty and staff are welcome.

FEDERAL COURT JUDICIAL INTERNSHIPS IN SAN ANTONIO

Semesters: Summer 2014, Fall 2014, and Spring 2015 Deadline: Noon, Wednesday, February 26, 2014

Applications are now being accepted for pre-graduation judicial internships with six federal judges who have chambers in San Antonio. This is the only time that applications will be solicited for internships with these courts during the next three semesters. Successful candidates typically have a strong academic record.

The United States Court of Appeals

There are two different internships available with judges on the Fifth Circuit. One is a four-credit, graded internship; the other is a two-credit pass/fail internship.

The Honorable Emilio M. Garza, a judge on the United States Court of Appeals for the

Fifth Circuit, will offer an internship position to one student each semester. Under the supervision of a law clerk in the judge*s chambers (which are located on IH-10 near Callaghan), interns will assist the judge with the drafting of opinions in cases pending before the nation's second highest court. Interns can expect to deal with perhaps three or more different cases. Interns are required to work 240 hours in chambers on a regular schedule during the semester, and earn four graded credits toward graduation, for which tuition must be paid. It is possible for the student to meet this time obligation by working four hours every weekday afternoon (e.g., 1-5 p.m. or 2-6 p.m.) for 12 of the 15 weeks in the fall or spring semesters. Other schedules are possible, but such arrangements must allow for intensive supervision of research and writing on a regular basis. Judge Garza is particularly interested in candidates with demonstrated writing ability. High academic standing is essential.

The Honorable Edward C. Prado, a judge on the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit, will offer an internship position to one student during each semester. Under the supervision of a law clerk in the judge*s chambers (which are located on Rt. 281 near Trinity University), interns will assist the judge with pending cases. The work will involve research and writing. Interns are required to work 120 hours in chambers on a regular schedule during the semester, and may earn two pass/fail credits toward graduation, for which tuition must be paid. It is possible for the student to meet this time obligation by working ten hours per week for 12 of the 15 weeks in the fall or spring semesters. Other schedules are possible. *High academic standing is essential*.

The United States District Court

At the United States District Court for the Western District of Texas, one internship will be available each semester with the Honorable David Ezra and the Honorable Xavier Rodriguez. Interns will assist the judges with a variety of tasks, which may include rulings on motions, preparation of jury charges, and other forms of research and writing related to trial court litigation. While it is unlikely that interns will work on opinions that are published, interns at the U.S. District Court (in contrast to those at the U.S. Court of Appeals) will have the opportunity to observe courtroom proceedings on a regular basis.

United States District Court interns are required to work 120 hours during the semester at the federal courthouse at Hemisfair Plaza in downtown San Antonio. Interns may earn two pass/fail credits, for which tuition must be paid. Successful candidates typically have a strong academic record.

The United States Magistrate Court

At the United States Magistrate Court, one internship will be available each semester with the Honorable Pamela Mathy and the Honorable Henry Bemporad during each of the next three semesters. (Judge Bemporad's spring 2015 intern will be selected from students in his fall 2014 seminar at the Law School, rather than through this process.) Magistrate judges handle motions and other matters at the request of the United States District Court and may preside over trials with the consent of the parties. This internship provides an excellent opportunity for a

student to improve his or her research and writing skills while assisting the federal courts in their important work. Successful candidates typically have a strong academic record.

Pass/Fail Credit Limitations

Students may not count toward graduation more than eight ungraded (pass/fail) elective credit hours earned at St. Mary's.

Applications

Interested students should submit an application to Professor Vincent R. Johnson. Please give your application materials to Ms. Nolvia Ramos on the second floor of the Raba Law Faculty Building. Questions can be directed to Professor Johnson at: vjohnson@stmarytx.edu.

An application should include:

- (1) One federal court internship form, available from Ms. Ramos. (The form asks a student to indicate the judges to which the student is applying and the semesters the student is available to serve as an intern.)
 - (2) For each judge by whom a candidate would like to be considered:
 - One resume, including cumulative GPA and current class rank;
 - One cover letter in business-letter format (return address, date, judge's address, proper salutation (*e.g.*, Dear Judge Garza), and signature. In terms of tone, the letter should be restrained, professional, factual, interesting, and confident;
 - Please staple the cover letter to the front of the resume. Please do not use special folders or bindings; they will be removed before the applications are sent to the judges.
- (3) Applicants for a U.S. Court of Appeals internship with Judge Emilio Garza should, if possible, furnish one writing sample (*e.g.*, a Legal Writing memo or brief, a copy of an exam essay, a law journal comment, etc.). Writing samples should not be included for the other courts.

FOURTH COURT OF APPEALS TO HEAR ORAL ARGUMENTS

The **Fourth Court of Appeals** will hear oral arguments in two appeals on **Tuesday**, **March 18, 2014** at St. Mary's Law School beginning at 9:30 a.m.

The first case, 04-13-00386-CR *Deshawn Ondrey Williams v. The State of Texas*, will be heard before the following panel of justices: Justice Karen Angelini, Justice Patricia Alvarez and Justice Luz Elena D. Chapa. Appellant Deshawn Ondrey Williams was found guilty by a jury for the offense of terroristic threats against a public servant. In his first issue on appeal,

Williams argues the evidence is legally insufficient to prove that the alleged threat was made with the specific intent to place the witness in fear of *imminent* serious bodily injury or death. More specifically, Williams argues that even assuming the alleged facts were accurate, the alleged threat was for an event to occur the following week and, therefore, the threat could not have been imminent. In his second issue, Williams contends that because he was indigent, the trial court erroneously ordered Williams to pay attorneys' fees.

The second case, 04-13-00326-CR *Benny Alonzo v. The State of Texas*, will begin at 10:30 a.m. and be heard by the panel of: Chief Justice Catherine Stone, Justice Sandee Bryan Marion, and Justice Rebeca C. Martinez. Appellant, Benny Alonzo, appeals his conviction for unlawful possession of a firearm by a felon. In two issues on appeal, appellant asserts (1) the trial court erred in denying his motion to suppress, and (2) the evidence is legally insufficient to support his conviction.

FOURTH COURT OF APPEALS TO HEAR ORAL ARGUMENTS

The **Fourth Court of Appeals** will hear oral arguments in two appeals on **Tuesday, March 18, 2014** at St. Mary's Law School beginning at 9:30 a.m.

The first case, 04-13-00386-CR *Deshawn Ondrey Williams v. The State of Texas*, will be heard before the following panel of justices: Justice Karen Angelini, Justice Patricia Alvarez and Justice Luz Elena D. Chapa. Appellant Deshawn Ondrey Williams was found guilty by a jury for the offense of terroristic threats against a public servant. In his first issue on appeal, Williams argues the evidence is legally insufficient to prove that the alleged threat was made with the specific intent to place the witness in fear of *imminent* serious bodily injury or death. More specifically, Williams argues that even assuming the alleged facts were accurate, the alleged threat was for an event to occur the following week and, therefore, the threat could not have been imminent. In his second issue, Williams contends that because he was indigent, the

trial court erroneously ordered Williams to pay attorneys' fees.

The second case, 04-13-00326-CR *Benny Alonzo v. The State of Texas*, will begin at 10:30 a.m. and be heard by the panel of: Chief Justice Catherine Stone, Justice Sandee Bryan Marion, and Justice Rebeca C. Martinez. Appellant, Benny Alonzo, appeals his conviction for unlawful possession of a firearm by a felon. In two issues on appeal, appellant asserts (1) the trial court erred in denying his motion to suppress, and (2) the evidence is legally insufficient to support his conviction.

FOURTH COURT OF APPEALS TO HEAR ORAL ARGUMENTS

The **Fourth Court of Appeals** will hear oral arguments in two appeals on **Tuesday**, **March 18, 2014** at St. Mary's Law School beginning at 9:30 a.m.

The first case, 04-13-00386-CR *Deshawn Ondrey Williams v. The State of Texas*, will be heard before the following panel of justices: Justice Karen Angelini, Justice Patricia Alvarez and Justice Luz Elena D. Chapa. Appellant Deshawn Ondrey Williams was found guilty by a jury for the offense of terroristic threats against a public servant. In his first issue on appeal, Williams argues the evidence is legally insufficient to prove that the alleged threat was made with the specific intent to place the witness in fear of *imminent* serious bodily injury or death. More specifically, Williams argues that even assuming the alleged facts were accurate, the alleged threat was for an event to occur the following week and, therefore, the threat could not have been imminent. In his second issue, Williams contends that because he was indigent, the trial court erroneously ordered Williams to pay attorneys' fees.

The second case, 04-13-00326-CR *Benny Alonzo v. The State of Texas*, will begin at 10:30 a.m. and be heard by the panel of: Chief Justice Catherine Stone, Justice Sandee Bryan Marion, and Justice Rebeca C. Martinez. Appellant, Benny Alonzo, appeals his conviction for unlawful possession of a firearm by a felon. In two issues on appeal, appellant asserts (1) the trial court erred in denying his motion to suppress, and (2) the evidence is legally insufficient to support his conviction.

A reception will follow in the Alumni Room at 12:00 p.m. for presentation of the Alma Lopez "Women in Law" Leadership Award and the inaugural Catherine M. Stone "Rock of Justice" Award. FOURTH COURT OF APPEALS TO HEAR ORAL ARGUMENTS

The **Fourth Court of Appeals** will hear oral arguments in two appeals on **Tuesday**, **March 18, 2014** at St. Mary's Law School beginning at 9:30 a.m.

The first case, 04-13-00386-CR *Deshawn Ondrey Williams v. The State of Texas*, will be heard before the following panel of justices: Justice Karen Angelini, Justice Patricia Alvarez and Justice Luz Elena D. Chapa. Appellant Deshawn Ondrey Williams was found guilty by a jury for the offense of terroristic threats against a public servant. In his first issue on appeal, Williams argues the evidence is legally insufficient to prove that the alleged threat was made with the specific intent to place the witness in fear of *imminent* serious bodily injury or death. More specifically, Williams argues that even assuming the alleged facts were accurate, the alleged threat was for an event to occur the following week and, therefore, the threat could not have been imminent. In his second issue, Williams contends that because he was indigent, the trial court erroneously ordered Williams to pay attorneys' fees.

The second case, 04-13-00326-CR *Benny Alonzo v. The State of Texas*, will begin at 10:30 a.m. and be heard by the panel of: Chief Justice Catherine Stone, Justice Sandee Bryan Marion, and Justice Rebeca C. Martinez. Appellant, Benny Alonzo, appeals his conviction for unlawful possession of a firearm by a felon. In two issues on appeal, appellant asserts (1) the trial court erred in denying his motion to suppress, and (2) the evidence is legally insufficient to support his conviction.

A reception will follow in the Alumni Room at 12:00 p.m. for presentation of the Alma Lopez "Women in Law" Leadership Award and the inaugural Catherine M. Stone "Rock of Justice" Award. This past weekend, the St. Mary's External Advocacy Program (EAP) Moot Court Team of **Stephen Bachran** (2L) and **Hannah Cottrill** (2L) traveled to Washington, D.C. to compete in the Seventeenth Annual Federal Bar Association Thurgood A. Marshall Memorial Moot Court Tournament. Stephen and Hannah **bested forty-five other moot court teams from all over the country** (the most ever assembled for this competition) to claim their **first National Title** and the <u>fourth National Championship for St. Mary's EAP Moot Court.</u>

Along the way to their title, Stephen Bachran was recognized as the **Second Best Overall Advocate** in the Preliminary Rounds and Hannah Cottrill received the distinction of **Best Advocate** in the Championship Round.
