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Abstract The extant records of the Law School of Saint Mary's University of San Antonio, Texas are assembled from the offices of the president, the vice president for academics, and other administrators. These records were generated by various administrators in pursuit of the educational objectives of the university. They include memos and letters between the law deans and the university administration, deliberations about educational policy, about faculty compensation, about tenure policies, and about curriculum. Also present are some records relating to law student associations, programs for in-service legal education ("law clinics"), and law school publications.

**Custodial History**: The records assembled into this subgroup were transferred from the administrative offices of the University directly to the University Archives where they have remained in custody continuously since.

Acquisitions Information: Around June 1994, the offices in St. Louis Hall transferred many records to the University Archives principally from the president, the vice president for academics, the vice president for finances, and the registrar. The university archivist at that time extracted from these any records concerning the Law School and formed them into a subgroup. From the 1990s to 2010, the university archivist added records to the Law School subgroup as they were transferred to the archives from any office. None of the records in Law School subgroup came to the University Archives directly from the Law School.

**Processing Information**: The Law School subgroup was assembled from records received from different sources. In most cases, the file folders were kept intact but were assigned new subject headings. Some file folders were consolidated with similar contents in other folders. Still other file folders were purposely constructed from isolated items solely on the basis of subject similarity. These various file folders were arranged by two methods. Some were arranged chronologically by the tenure of the individual law deans. Alternatively, series that exceeded the tenure of a single law dean were arranged alphabetically by file folder titles.

### Administrative History Note

The School of Law was added to the University on October 1, 1934. Previous to this date it was operated independently of any accrediting authority by the Bar Association of San Antonio. Beginning in October 1927, classes were offered in the Bexar County Courthouse under the direction of a Board of Governors. This arrangement continued for seven years. On October 1, 1934 the law school was officially transferred to St. Mary's University. Classes moved to the former downtown campus of St. Mary's College located at 112 College Street, the present site of La Manson Del Rio on the Riverwalk. The first dean was Anton N. Moursand, a San Antonio attorney; who was followed by Henry B. Dielman from 1938 to 1942. Very few records remain from the early days in the 1930s. During the years of World War II (1942-1945) operations were curtailed. Then in 1946, Ernest A. Raba began as law dean and the school was reorganized to meet the requirements of the American Bar Association and the Association of American Law Schools. In February 1948, the American Bar Association approved the school, and in December 1949, the school was admitted to membership in the Association of American Law Schools. In December 1966 the Law School moved to temporary quarters at 213 East Travis Street, immediately behind the Gunter Hotel, until in January 1968, when it began classes in newly built quarters at the Woodlawn campus. In 1969, the Law School launched the St. Mary's Law Journal. During the 1970s the Law School grew in complexity and made adjustments to fit better into the general university structure. In 1989, Barbara Bader Aldave become the first woman dean of any school at St. Mary's and the only woman dean at any of the eight law schools in Texas. During her tenure clinical legal education and *pro bono* public service projects for the students became an important focus as well as admission of students from minority ethnic groups.

### Collection Overview

The extant records about the Law School of Saint Mary's University are assembled from the offices of the president, the vice president for academics, and other administrators. These records were generated mostly by interaction between the university administration and the law school deans; and to a lesser extent the law faculty, students, and law alumni. The records between the deans and the university administration concern the attainment of the educational objectives of the university. The deliberations of the law faculty are about educational policy, faculty compensation, tenure policies, and curriculum. Also present to a lesser degree are records relating to the law library, the law student associations, the programs for in-service legal education ("law clinics"), and law student publications. A number of records concern the alumni of the law school. Among the annual events with representation in the records are Commencements (1961-2000), Law Day (1957-1978), and the "Red Mass" (1952-2004). A small collection of newspaper clippings (1937-2000) about the Law School are consolidated into a series by date. Around 2020 the Public History Program sought information from the Law School about the existence of archives in its care and after a diligent search came to the conclusion that none remained from previous deanships. If their findings are correct, then this assemblage of records is all that remains.

# Series 1: First Years, 1934-1946

**History Note**: Although the earliest document among the law school records bears the date 1931, it is a brochure published by the American Bar Association. The earliest document generated by the Law School dates only to 1935. During these first years, the law school functioned under the accreditation of St. Mary's University. From 1938 to 1942, Henry B. Dielman, from among the law faculty, served as "dean-registrar." No one with the title of dean functioned during the years of World War II (1942-1945). Then in 1946, Ernest A. Raba from among the law faculty was appointed law dean.

### Red Mass, 1952-2004

**Historical Note**: The "Red Mass" is so-called because the officiating clergy wear red vestments in honor of the Holy Spirit and because it was the custom for royal judges to wear red robes during the 12<sup>th</sup> century when the Red Masses began in Paris. The custom extended to Rome and to London. From London it came to the United States in 1928 at St. Andrew's Church in New York City. In San Antonio, the Red Mass is celebrated at the Cathedral of San Fernando. The date selected is near the opening of the new term of the US Supreme Court.
