Professor Jeffrey F. Addicott is a Distinguished Professor of Law and the Director of the Center for Terrorism Law at St. Mary's University School of Law, San Antonio, Texas. An active duty Army officer in the Judge Advocate General's Corps for 20 years (he retired in 2000 at the rank of Lieutenant Colonel), Professor Addicott spent a quarter of his career as a senior legal advisor to the United States Army's Special Forces. As an internationally recognized authority on national security law, terrorism law and human rights law, Professor Addicott not only lectures and participates in professional and academic organizations both in the United States and abroad, but he is also a frequent contributor to national and international news shows to include FOX News Channel and MSNBC. Professor Addicott is a prolific author, publishing over 20 books, articles, and monographs on a variety of legal topics.

Among his many contributions to the field, Professor Addicott pioneered the teaching of law of war and human rights courses to the militaries of numerous nascent democracies in Eastern Europe and Latin America. For these efforts he was awarded the Legion of Merit, named the "Army Judge Advocate of the Year," and honored as a co-recipient of the American Bar Association's Hodson Award. Addicott has served in senior legal positions in Germany, Korea,

Panama, and throughout the United States. Professor Addicott holds a Doctor of Juridical Science (S.J.D.) and Master of Laws (LL.M.) from the University of Virginia School of Law. He also received a Master of Laws (LL.M.) from the Army Judge Advocate General's School and a Juris Doctor (J.D.) from the University of Alabama School of Law. Apart from teaching a variety of courses at the law school, Dr. Addicott served as the Associate Dean for Administration at St. Mary's University School of Law (2006-2007). Dr. Addicott was the 2007 recipient of "St. Mary's University School of Law Distinguished Faculty Award."

Now in its 53rd year, the Philip C. Jessup International Law Moot Court Competition is the world's largest moot court competition, with participants from over 500 law schools in more than 80 countries. The Competition is a simulation of a fictional dispute between countries before the International Court of Justice, the judicial organ of the United Nations. One team is

allowed to participate from every eligible school. Teams prepare oral and written pleadings arguing both the applicant and respondent positions of the case.

Thousands of law students from around the world will work all year long on this season's Jessup Problem, which will address the legality of the destruction of a cultural site, who may represent a State after a coup d'état, and State responsibility for a regional operation. Most students must first compete in national and regional competitions (mostly held in January-March) to earn the right to advance to the White & Case International Rounds held every spring in Washington, D.C.

Lindsey Harris is a research fellow at the St. Mary's University Center for Terrorism Law. She will graduate in December 2011 with a Juris Doctorate and a Master's degree in International Relations from St. Mary's University. Lindsey also holds a Bachelor's Degree in Sociology from Texas A&M University. While on a study abroad trip in Jerusalem, Lindsey received the 2010 CALI Excellence for the Future Award for excellence in achievement in the study of the Arab-Israeli conflict and its resolution. Lindsey has since spent three months in Egypt collecting data about Post-Revolution Egypt and the implications for American foreign policy.

After the January 25 Revolution began in Egypt this year and following the ouster of 30-year President Hosni Mubarak, the country has been going through the difficult yet exciting transition to democracy. As the second largest recipient of US foreign aid behind Israel, The United States has a longtime vested interest in the fate of Egypt and has strong ties with its government officials and military. The fragile 1979 peace treaty between Egypt and Israel is also of great significance to the United States due to the intimate connection America has formed with Israel over the past few decades.

To gather opinion data, Lindsey interviewed Egyptians ranging from public officials in the Housing and Development Authority, a Judge and Cyber security expert, taxi drivers, representatives from the youth movements that carried out the January 25th Revolution, and Egyptian intelligence officials. According to Lindsey, the most striking commonality between the large cross-section of interviewees was their distaste for America's continued and largely uncritical support of the state of Israel despite their numerous violations of international law including the expansion of settlements on occupied Palestinian territory, the indiscriminate killing of civilians (i.e., During Operation Cast Lead) and the multiplicity of humanitarian abuses inflicted on the Palestinians on a regular basis (i.e., Israel's refusal to provide water to refugee populations, house demolitions, and the blockade of Gaza).

America's Global War on Terror has produced mixed results across the board; The United States has not suffered any further large scale terrorist attacks on its soil, Bin Laden is dead, Guantanamo Bay still has prisoners "of war" and American troops are still in Afghanistan

and Iraq. The only certainty is that terrorism begins with an idea, an idea so strong that it can drive a person to kill innocent people and themselves. America's first defense against terrorism and potentially the most efficient is to start fighting the idea. According to Lindsey, America's national security should be top priority for policy makers and the growing anti-American sentiment across the newly liberated Middle East is reason for concern and a re-evaluation of American foreign policy.

Some key questions that need to be addressed are: How are National Security and Foreign policy tied to the U.S. Constitution? Is America's National Security being directly threatened by Israel? Why do Americans fear the Muslim Brotherhood in Egypt? What can we do to reconcile with the revolutionary Middle East? If the Terrorists don't hate us because of our freedom and sheer awesomeness, why do they hate us?

FEDERAL COURT JUDICIAL INTERNSHIPS IN SAN ANTONIO

Semesters: Summer 2012, Fall 2012, and Spring 2013 Deadline: 4:00 p.m., Wednesday, February 22, 2012

Applications are now being accepted for pre-graduation judicial internships with four federal judges who have chambers in San Antonio.  - One cover letter in business-letter format (date; return address, judge's address, proper salutation (e.g., Dear Judge Garza). In terms of tone, the letter should be restrained, professional, factual, and confident.
 - Please staple the cover letter to the front of the resume. Please do not use special folders or bindings; they will be removed before the applications are sent to the judges.
- (3) Applicants for a U.S. Court of Appeals internship with Judge Emilio Garza should, if possible, furnish one writing sample (*e.g.*, a Legal Writing memo or brief, a copy of an exam essay, a law journal comment, etc.). Writing samples should not be included for the other courts.

FOURTH COURT OF APPEALS TO HEAR ORAL ARGUMENT

The **Fourth Court of Appeals** will hear oral arguments in two appeals on **Wednesday, March 7, 2012**, beginning at **1:30 p.m.** at St. Mary's University. Arguments will be presented to a panel of justices consisting of: Justice Karen Angelini, Justice Sandee Bryan Marion, and Justice Phylis J. Speedlin. The second panel to hear arguments will consist of Justice Rebecca Simmons, Justice Steven C. Hilbig and Justice Marialyn Barnard.

The following cases will be presented:

04-11-00101-CV, Garza v. Zachry Constr. Corp, et al. Panel: Justice Karen Angelini, Justice Sandee Bryan Marion and Justice Phylis Speedlin.

This is an appeal from a take-nothing summary judgment rendered in favor of appellees. The issues on appeal center on the workers' compensation bar contained in Texas Labor Code section 408.001. Garza is the employee of a general contractor and appellees are a subcontractor and its two employees. In his first issue, Garza asserts his common-law tort claims against the two employees of the subcontractor are not barred by the exclusive remedy provided under the Texas Workers' Compensation Act because the subcontractor contractually agreed it employees were not the employees of the general contractor. In his second issue, he asserts any such bar to his claims violates the Texas Constitution's open courts guarantee.

04-11-00332-CV, The Estate of Francisco Julio Lerma Sanchez, Deceased, Panel: Justice Rebecca Simmons, Justice Steven C. Hilbig and Justice Marialyn Barnard.

This is an appeal of a summary judgment on the non-existence of a common law marriage between the late Francisco Julio Lerma Sanchez and Carmen Viera-Pena Lerma. The trial court determined that Ms. Lerma did not establish the elements of common law marriage in section 2.401 of the Texas Family Code. The section 2.401 Texas Family Code provides that a common law marriage occurs if a "man and woman agreed to be married and after the agreement they lived in this state as husband and wife and they represented to others that they were married." On appeal Ms. Lerma contends there was evidence to establish a common law marriage or alternatively she raised a fact issue on whether there was a common law marriage.

ACADEMIC COURSE CREDIT FOR REGIONAL AND NATIONAL COMPETITIONS

Students who represent St. Mary's and compete in regional and national advocacy competitions are eligible to receive one-hour of academic credit for their participation. The student must have actually competed, or written a brief as a part of the competition, in order to receive the credit. Practicing with the team or traveling with a team as an alternate will not qualify. To apply for the credit, contact Professor Schlueter for a copy of the eligibility form, obtain the coach's signature certifying that you competed, and then get Professor Schlueter's signature. You will need to submit the completed form to Ms. Catherine Mery, Director of Enrollment, Law Admissions, who will register you for the course. Once registered, you will need to pay tuition for the one-hour credit. All of this must be done in the semester in which you competed. Credit for the course will be on a pass-fail basis; your participation in the competition does not constitute an excused absence for any other classes; and the maximum number of credits available for regional and national competitions is three (3) hours of credit. Do not complete the form *until* after you have actually competed. If you have any questions, please contact Professor Schlueter, who is the Director of Advocacy Programs.

Semesters: Summer 2012, Fall 2012, and Spring 2013 Deadline: 4:00 p.m., Wednesday, February 22, 2012

Applications are now being accepted for pre-graduation judicial internships with four federal judges who have chambers in San Antonio. This is the only time that applications will be solicited for internships with these courts during the next three semesters. *Successful candidates typically have a strong academic record*.

Eligibility of Full-Time and Part-Time Students: Students may apply for any internship that will commence in a semester after the student has completed 30 hours of course work. Thus, a first-year, full-time student may apply for an internship that will take place in the summer between first and second year, or during any subsequent semester. A first-year, part-time student may applying for a judicial internship that commences in spring of the student's second year or later.

The United States Court of Appeals

There are two different internships available with judges on the Fifth Circuit. One is a four-credit, graded internship; the other is a two-credit pass/fail internship.

The Honorable Emilio M. Garza, a Judge on the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit, will offer four-credit graded internship positions to one or two students during each semester.

 - Please staple the cover letter to the front of the resume. Please do not use special folders or bindings; they will be removed before the applications are sent to the judges.
- (3) Applicants for a U.S. Court of Appeals internship with Judge Emilio Garza should, if possible, furnish one writing sample (*e.g.*, a Legal Writing memo or brief, a copy of an exam essay, a law journal comment, etc.). Writing samples should not be included for the other courts.

FOURTH COURT OF APPEALS TO HEAR ORAL ARGUMENT

The **Fourth Court of Appeals** will hear oral arguments in two appeals on **Wednesday, March 7, 2012**, beginning at **1:30 p.m.** at St. Mary's University. Arguments will be presented to a panel of justices consisting of: Justice Karen Angelini, Justice Sandee Bryan Marion, and Justice Phylis J. Speedlin. The second panel to hear arguments will consist of Justice Rebecca Simmons, Justice Steven C. Hilbig and Justice Marialyn Barnard.

The following cases will be presented:

04-11-00101-CV, Garza v. Zachry Constr. Corp, et al. Panel: Justice Karen Angelini, Justice Sandee Bryan Marion and Justice Phylis Speedlin.

This is an appeal from a take-nothing summary judgment rendered in favor of appellees. The issues on appeal center on the workers' compensation bar contained in Texas Labor Code section 408.001. Garza is the employee of a general contractor and appellees are a subcontractor and its two employees. In his first issue, Garza asserts his common-law tort claims against the two employees of the subcontractor are not barred by the exclusive remedy provided under the Texas Workers' Compensation Act because the subcontractor contractually agreed it employees were not the employees of the general contractor. In his second issue, he asserts any such bar to his claims violates the Texas Constitution's open courts guarantee.

04-11-00332-CV, The Estate of Francisco Julio Lerma Sanchez, Deceased, Panel: Justice Rebecca Simmons, Justice Steven C. Hilbig and Justice Marialyn Barnard.

This is an appeal of a summary judgment on the non-existence of a common law marriage between the late Francisco Julio Lerma Sanchez and Carmen Viera-Pena Lerma. The trial court determined that Ms. Lerma did not establish the elements of common law marriage in section 2.401 of the Texas Family Code. The section 2.401 Texas Family Code provides that a common law marriage occurs if a "man and woman agreed to be married and after the agreement they lived in this state as husband and wife and they represented to others that they were married." On appeal Ms. Lerma contends there was evidence to establish a common law marriage or alternatively she raised a fact issue on whether there was a common law marriage.

FOURTH COURT OF APPEALS TO HEAR ORAL ARGUMENTS

The **Fourth Court of Appeals** will hear oral arguments in two appeals on **Wednesday**, **March 7, 2012**, beginning at **1:30 p.m.** at St. Mary's University. Arguments will be presented to a panel of justices consisting of: Justice Karen Angelini, Justice Sandee Bryan Marion, and Justice Phylis J. Speedlin. The second panel to hear arguments will consist of Justice Rebecca Simmons, Justice Steven C. Hilbig and Justice Marialyn Barnard.

The following cases will be presented:

04-11-00101-CV, Garza v. Zachry Constr. Corp, et al. Panel: Justice Karen Angelini, Justice Sandee Bryan Marion and Justice Phylis Speedlin.

This is an appeal from a take-nothing summary judgment rendered in favor of appellees. The issues on appeal center on the workers' compensation bar contained in Texas Labor Code section

408.001. Garza is the employee of a general contractor and appellees are a subcontractor and its two employees. In his first issue, Garza asserts his common-law tort claims against the two employees of the subcontractor are not barred by the exclusive remedy provided under the Texas Workers' Compensation Act because the subcontractor contractually agreed it employees were not the employees of the general contractor. In his second issue, he asserts any such bar to his claims violates the Texas Constitution's open courts guarantee.

04-11-00332-CV, The Estate of Francisco Julio Lerma Sanchez, Deceased, Panel: Justice Rebecca Simmons, Justice Steven C. Hilbig and Justice Marialyn Barnard.

This is an appeal of a summary judgment on the non-existence of a common law marriage between the late Francisco Julio Lerma Sanchez and Carmen Viera-Pena Lerma. The trial court determined that Ms. Lerma did not establish the elements of common law marriage in section 2.401 of the Texas Family Code. The section 2.401 Texas Family Code provides that a common law marriage occurs if a "man and woman agreed to be married and after the agreement they lived in this state as husband and wife and they represented to others that they were married." On appeal Ms. Lerma contends there was evidence to establish a common law marriage or alternatively she raised a fact issue on whether there was a common law marriage.

FOURTH COURT OF APPEALS TO HEAR ORAL ARGUMENTS

The **Fourth Court of Appeals** will hear oral arguments in two appeals on **Wednesday, March 7, 2012**, beginning at **1:30 p.m.** at St. Mary's University. Arguments will be presented to a panel of justices consisting of: Justice Karen Angelini, Justice Sandee Bryan Marion, and Justice Phylis J. Speedlin. The second panel to hear arguments will consist of Justice Rebecca Simmons, Justice Steven C. Hilbig and Justice Marialyn Barnard.

The following cases will be presented:

04-11-00101-CV, Garza v. Zachry Constr. Corp, et al. Panel: Justice Karen Angelini, Justice Sandee Bryan Marion and Justice Phylis Speedlin.

This is an appeal from a take-nothing summary judgment rendered in favor of appellees. The issues on appeal center on the workers' compensation bar contained in Texas Labor Code section 408.001. Garza is the employee of a general contractor and appellees are a subcontractor and its two employees. In his first issue, Garza asserts his common-law tort claims against the two employees of the subcontractor are not barred by the exclusive remedy provided under the Texas Workers' Compensation Act because the subcontractor contractually agreed it employees were not the employees of the general contractor. In his second issue, he asserts any such bar to his claims violates the Texas Constitution's open courts guarantee.

04-11-00332-CV, The Estate of Francisco Julio Lerma Sanchez, Deceased, Panel: Justice Rebecca Simmons, Justice Steven C. Hilbig and Justice Marialyn Barnard.

This is an appeal of a summary judgment on the non-existence of a common law marriage

between the late Francisco Julio Lerma Sanchez and Carmen Viera-Pena Lerma. The trial court determined that Ms. Lerma did not establish the elements of common law marriage in section 2.401 of the Texas Family Code. The section 2.401 Texas Family Code provides that a common law marriage occurs if a "man and woman agreed to be married and after the agreement they lived in this state as husband and wife and they represented to others that they were married." On appeal Ms. Lerma contends there was evidence to establish a common law marriage or alternatively she raised a fact issue on whether there was a common law marriage.
