Abstract: This is a collection of materials related to the Jesuit priest Carmelo A. Tranchese obtained by the library staff from several sources to support the thesis research of Gilbert Quezada. Tranchese's personal papers were gathered from the Jesuit Province of New Orleans. His diary and scrapbook of parish life were gathered from his parish in San Antonio, Guadalupe Church. Facsimiles were made and the originals returned. To these facsimiles was added a collection made by library staff consisting of ephemera and letters from local clergy recounting their recollections of Fr. Tranchese.

Acquisition: The papers, letters, and relics of Father Carmelo A. Tranchese, SJ held by the New Orleans Jesuit Province Archives were loaned to St. Mary's University Academic Library as of March 16, 1971 for research use by Gilberto Quezada in preparation for a thesis about Father Tranchese. With the permission of the Jesuit Archives, the Academic Library microfilmed the Tranchese papers and provided that archives with positive images of that microfilm. The original documents were returned to the Jesuit Province Archives. The diary and scrapbook made by Fr. Tranchese as pastor of Our Lady of Guadalupe Church in San Antonio were borrowed from that parish, microfilmed and returned. (See Donor File for Tranchese)
Processing: The papers from the Jesuit Archives are arranged in four subseries by subject and within subjects by date. The diary and scrapbook for Guadalupe Parish are in order by date. The materials collected by St. Mary's Library staff are arranged roughly by date.

Biographical Note

Father Carmelo Antonio Tranchese, SJ (1880-) has often been described as a missionary to Texas, a social justice crusader, a Renaissance man, a humanitarian, and the father of public housing in San Antonio. To his Hispanic parishioners, however, *el padrecito*, fitted all the above labels. During his twenty years at Our Lady of Guadalupe Church, he labored to alleviate the economic and social plight of his parishioners. He became the first Catholic priest in San Antonio to become involved with the social issues that faced his community during the hard days of the Great Depression." [Source: J. Arrangement Note: Before loaning the Tranchese Papers to St. Mary’s University for microfilming, Fr. James D Carroll, the archivist of the Jesuit Province of New Orleans, prepared an item listing of them. The arrangement used in this inventory follows Fr. Carroll’s listing. Fr. Carroll’s item listing is filed with the papers and provides date, format, names of respondents and date.

Subsequent Disposition: In January 2018, Blume Library staff was notified that the hardcopy original documents of the Tranchese Papers were destroyed by Fr. Carroll of the Jesuit Archives after they were returned. The rationale was that since microfilm existed the originals were no longer needed.
