FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS MANDATORY MEETING WITH THE TEXAS BOARD OF LAW EXAMINERS

The timely filing deadline for the Declaration of Intent by first-year students is October 1, 2008; the cost is \$190. A late fee of \$150 is imposed if this deadline is not met.

STUDENT ORGANIZATION GUIDELINES

The below guidelines are offered for student organization funding.

I. Organization Funding

- A. In order to receive funds from the law school a student organization must:
 - i. Be officially approved by the law faculty;

- ii. Have submitted to the SBA a current list of officers and have contact information; and
- iii. Comply with the rules on fundraising, publicity, and use of facilities stated below.

All funding requests shall be submitted in writing to the Student Bar Association with the appropriate form.

- B. Initial Activity Grants. Each semester, each officially approved student organization is entitled to receive an initial activity grant of \$150 to support an event on campus, open to the law school community that contributes to the intellectual life of the law school, such as speakers, panels and the like. The money may be used for refreshments to help draw a crowd or for other costs of the event. A closed meeting of organization membership or party does not qualify for a grant. Two or more organizations may pool their funds to sponsor an event, although amounts spent on food for an event ordinarily may not exceed \$150. An organization that uses less than \$150 of an initial activity grant may use the balance of the grant for similar purposes later in the semester. No entitlements are carried over from semester to semester or year to year. For all purposes of these guidelines, "contributing to the intellectual life of the law school" shall be construed broadly.
- C. Additional Activity Grants. Each semester a limited number of additional discretionary activity grants in the amount of \$150, for the purpose of supporting activities open to the law school community that contribute to the intellectual life of the law school, may be made to organizations that have already used their initial grants to support successful events. The merits of such applicants will be judged not on the subject matter of the proposal, but on the basis of whether the event is well planned and not duplicative of other recent events.
- D. Public Service Grants. Each semester, 15 grants in the amount of \$150 will be available to support public service projects of student organizations. In an appropriate case, two or more organizations may receive grants to work on the same project.
- E. Extraordinary Grants. Limited funds may be available each semester to support extraordinarily meritorious student organization activities, including religious activities, that deserve financial support beyond that available through activity grants. Banquets will not be funded. However, organizations may hold banquets for their members, funded by membership dues, ticket sales, and fundraising.

II. Fundraising by Organizations

A. No student organization shall raise money contributions from any person or entity

to support student organizations activities without prior written approval of the law school Associate Dean Al Hartman. This rule does not apply to in-kind contributions, such as donations of merchandise and gift certificates, or sales where the buyer receives fair market value or donates the ticket or tickets back to the organization. Sponsorships require approval.

B. A form for requesting approval of fundraising is available from the Development office requiring the organization to identify with reasonable precision the nature of the fundraising activity, its magnitude, and the individuals, business, or firms who will be solicited. Following submission, a form will ordinarily be acted upon within one week. The approval process shall be conducted in a way that encourages continued philanthropic support (e.g. law firm sponsorship awards) established in past years.

POSTING NOTICES BY STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS

A student organization may publicize an event or deadline through announcements:

- i. In the *Witan* (provide copy to Ms. Bebe Gonzales (bgonzales@stmarytx.edu) by noon Thursday);
- ii. On its organization bulletin board;
- iii. On the posting walls in the east and west foyers of the law classroom building and in the west foyer of the law faculty building, provided the notice:
 - (1) not greater than 11" by 17" (legal size) and
 - (2) not posted more than ten days before an event;

Except as provided above, do not tape, staple, pin, or otherwise display any notice on walls or furniture of any building at the Law Center (including classroom entry doors). Announcements posted in violation of this rule will be removed.

WEBCASTING OF TEXAS SUPREME COURT ORAL ARGUMENTS

St. Mary's Law School hosts the **live webcasting** of the **Texas Supreme Court's** oral arguments. Under an agreement with the Texas Office of Court Administration, the University

supplies the technological support and personnel for the project. This is a wonderful opportunity for the public at large and our law school community to **see and hear the arguments live**, over the internet. We are one of only a handful of law schools in the nation that provide this unique access to live webcasting of oral arguments.

You can **access the arguments** from a link on the home page of the law school's website and from the Advocacy Programs pages on the law school's website. From those same links you can **access archived oral arguments** that have been broadcast since Spring 2007. When you access the page for the webcasting (hosted by Mediasite) you can also access links to the briefs filed in the case (pdf).

The **most recent** of oral arguments were held on November 12 and 13. The following summarizes those cases. If you have any questions about the webcasting of the arguments, please contact Professor Schlueter.

State of Texas v. George Lueck

The issues in this Whistleblower Act case are (1) whether Lueck, a Texas Transportation Department employee fired for questioning an outside vendor's contract termination, properly stated a claim under the act to confer jurisdiction on the trial court and (2) whether, if so, he properly reported violation of a state or federal law to an appropriate law-enforcement authority.

In re James Allen Hall

The principal issue is whether an adult held over from juvenile-delinquency confinement on a 40-year determinate sentence has a right to an attorney for a habeas corpus action.

In Re Lester Collins, M.D.

The principal issues in the medical-malpractice case are (1) whether the trial court abused its discretion by prohibiting ex parte communication with non-party physicians and health-care providers who treated the plaintiff and listed by her on the statutory schedule for disclosure and release; (2) whether Civil Practices and Remedies Code section 74.052 prohibits ex parte communications with the med-mal plaintiff's physicians and health-care providers; and (3) whether federal law (HIPAA) prohibits ex parte communications and preempts section 74.052.

In re Department of Family & Protective Services

The issues in this parental-rights termination case are (1) whether the trial court's new-trial order after the statutory dismissal deadline vacated a termination order rendered before the deadline passed; (2) whether an objection based on the trial court's failure to dismiss was waived because it came after the new-trial order; (3) whether mandamus relief is appropriate when the state can pursue an accelerated appeal; and (4) whether Family Code section 263.401(b) restrictions are jurisdictional.

Mann Frankfort Stein & Lipp Advisors Inc, et al. v. Brendan J. Fielding

Principal issues arising from this declaratory-judgment action are (1) whether a provision requiring an accountant to purchase clients if he left the firm was ancillary to his employment

agreement and an enforceable covenant not to compete; (2) whether the Covenants Not to Compete Act preempts the plaintiff's attorneys fees claim; and (3) whether the client-purchase provisions are severable.

Walter E. Harrell v. State of Texas

The principal issues are (1) whether the state is required to follow garnishment procedures to take money from a prisoner's inmate trust account to pay for his court-appointed attorney and court fees and (2) whether the court of appeals had jurisdiction to hear Harrell's appeal.

Lauri Smith and Howard Smith v. Patrick W.Y. Tam Trust

The principal issue is whether \$47,000 in attorneys fees are reasonable when the judgment obtained was for \$65,000, less than a third of what was sought.

UNITED STATES JUDICIAL CONFERENCE'S STANDING COMMITTEE MEETING

On January 12-13, 2009, St. Mary's University School of Law will host a meeting of the United States Judicial Conference's Committee on Rules of Practice and Procedure, commonly called the "Standing Committee." This Committee is charged with reviewing and amending the various Rules of Procedure used in the Federal Courts: Appellate, Bankruptcy, Civil, Criminal, and Evidence. The Committee reviews and coordinates the recommendations from the five advisory committees for those various rules and in turn recommends proposed rules changes to the Judicial Conference, chaired by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States. The Supreme Court reviews any proposed rules changes and forwards them to Congress, which can reject or accept them.

The Standing Committee and five advisory committees are composed of federal judges, law professors, state Supreme Court chief justices, practitioners, and representatives of the Department of Justice. In addition, each committee has a "reporter"—a law professor — who coordinates the committees' agendas and drafts proposed amendments and accompanying committee notes. **Judge Lee H. Rosenthal**, a federal district judge from Houston, is the current chair of the Committee. The current reporter is **Professor Dan Coquillete**, former Dean of Boston College of Law, and currently a member of the faculties of Harvard School of Law and Boston College School of Law.

The meeting, which is **open to the public**, will be held in the **Alumni Room of the Sarita Kenedy East Law Library** on the law school's campus. **Professor Dave Schlueter**, who served as the Reporter for the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure Advisory Committee for 17 years, stated that the law students and legal community will have a unique opportunity to witness first hand the process for considering amendments to the various federal rules. Normally, the Committee meets twice a year: once in Washington, D.C. and once at another location. Schlueter also stated that the school is very grateful for the assistance of **Judge Pat Higginbotham**, a judge on the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit and a visiting professor of law at the Law School, who helped arrange for the Committee to meet at our law school.

FOURTH COURT OF APPEALS TO HEAR ORAL ARGUMENTS ON CAMPUS

The Fourth Court of Appeals will hear oral arguments on Wednesday, March 18, 2009. Two cases will be heard beginning at 9:00 a.m. The panel to hear the cases include Justice Sandee Bryan Marion, Justice Phylis Speedlin and Justice Marialyn Barnard. Lunch will follow at 12:00 noon in the Alumni Room of the Sarita Kenedy East Law Library. In honor of Women's History Month, the Alma L. Lopez Woman in Law Student Leadership Award will be presented at 12:30 p.m. Below is a brief synopsis of the two cases.

Milestone Potranco Development, Ltd. v. City of San Antonio – No. 04-07-00479-CV

This appeal arises from a declaratory judgment in favor of appellee. The sole issue on appeal is whether the City of San Antonio has the authority to enforce its Tree Preservation Ordinance and Streetscape Planting Standards on appellant's property that is located outside the boundaries of the City of San Antonio but within its extraterritorial jurisdiction. On appeal, appellant argues the statutes relied on by the City for authority to enforce the Tree Preservation Ordinance and Streetscape Planting Standards do not expressly authorize such regulation.

Perkins v. City of San Antonio - No. 04-08-00341-CV

On December 10, 2007, the Dangerous Structure Determination Board of the City of San Antonio ordered Seymour G. Perkins to demolish the main structure (a house) located at 600 Hackberry Street because the Board determined that the house was a public nuisance in need of abatement. Perkins filed a petition in district court requesting injunctive relief which the trial court construed as a request for judicial review of the Board's order. The primary complaints raised by Perkins are: (1) the trial court deprived him of his right to present evidence at the hearing conducted by the trial court contrary to the substantial evidence rule and in violation of his due process rights; (2) the Board's order is void on its face; (3) the trial court's hearing was held without proper notice; (4) the trial court's failure to properly review the record deprived Perkins of his due process rights; (5) Perkins was denied due process by the Board's failure to appoint him an attorney or, at least, advise him of his right to an attorney; (6) the trial court's bias deprived him of due process; and (7) the Board's order is no longer effective.

FOURTH COURT OF APPEALS TO HEAR ORAL ARGUMENTS ON CAMPUS

The Fourth Court of Appeals will hear oral arguments on Wednesday, March 18, 2009. Two cases will be heard beginning at 9:00 a.m. The panel to hear the cases include Justice Sandee Bryan Marion, Justice Phylis Speedlin and Justice Marialyn Barnard. Lunch will follow at 12:00 noon in the Alumni Room of the Sarita Kenedy East Law Library. In honor of Women's History Month, the Alma L. Lopez Woman in Law Student Leadership Award will be presented at 12:30 p.m. Below is a brief synopsis of the two cases.

Milestone Potranco Development, Ltd. v. City of San Antonio – No. 04-07-00479-CV

This appeal arises from a declaratory judgment in favor of appellee. The sole issue on appeal is whether the City of San Antonio has the authority to enforce its Tree Preservation Ordinance and Streetscape Planting Standards on appellant's property that is located outside the boundaries of the City of San Antonio but within its extraterritorial jurisdiction. On appeal, appellant argues the statutes relied on by the City for authority to enforce the Tree Preservation Ordinance and Streetscape Planting Standards do not expressly authorize such regulation.

Perkins v. City of San Antonio - No. 04-08-00341-CV

On December 10, 2007, the Dangerous Structure Determination Board of the City of San Antonio ordered Seymour G. Perkins to demolish the main structure (a house) located at 600 Hackberry Street because the Board determined that the house was a public nuisance in need of abatement. Perkins filed a petition in district court requesting injunctive relief which the trial court construed as a request for judicial review of the Board's order. The primary complaints raised by Perkins are: (1) the trial court deprived him of his right to present evidence at the hearing conducted by the trial court contrary to the substantial evidence rule and in violation of his due process rights; (2) the Board's order is void on its face; (3) the trial court's hearing was held without proper notice; (4) the trial court's failure to properly review the record deprived Perkins of his due process rights; (5) Perkins was denied due process by the Board's failure to appoint him an attorney or, at least, advise him of his right to an attorney; (6) the trial court's bias deprived him of due process; and (7) the Board's order is no longer effective.

MOOT COURT TEAM WINS!

This password allows you to access only the database of TX oral argument transcripts. If you try to access other databases, such as the TX briefs, you will get a pop-up box that this content is outside of your subscription.
