Office of Law Success

The former Office of Academic Affairs is now the Office of Law Success. It can be found in RABA 107. Professor Zoe Niesel is the new director and she is assisted by five Law Success Instructors. As part of the new programming, below are two classes to consider adding to your schedule.

MPT Course: one (1) credit hour course directed at the MPT -- the Multistate Performance Test -- a component of the Bar Exam on which St. Mary's graduates historically have severely underperformed. So that current 3L students can take advantage of this new course two of these new classes have been added, officially called Experiential Legal Analysis. (Tuesdays from 7:25 - 9:05 p.m. and Fridays from 9:00 -10:50 a.m.)

<u>Bar Prep for Credit</u>: The best time to take the Bar Preparation course may be in the <u>fall</u> of the 3L year (not in the spring, when students traditionally have taken it). By taking the class in the fall, students identify areas of concern for Bar Exam preparation a semester earlier and have the spring semester of their 3L year to work with the Office of Law Success on ways of addressing those concerns. Two of these Bar Exam Preparation classes have been added to the fall schedule if you wish to add one. (Mondays from 3:00-4:50 p.m., and Wednesdays from 6:00-7:50 p.m.)

Federal Court Judicial Internships in San Antonio

St. Mary's Moot Court Team Advances to the National Finals of the 2017 ABA National Appellate Advocacy Competition

Over the weekend, St. Mary's EAP Moot Court competed in the American Bar Association's National Appellate Advocacy Competition. The ABA NAAC is the largest moot court tournament in the United States, with approximately 200 law schools competing in six regions for the opportunity to reach Chicago and participate in the National Finals of this most prestigious event. Two St. Mary's teams: William "Billy" Calve (3L), Sophia George (2L), and Devin DeBruyn (3L) and Gary Hillier (2L), Cali Franks (2L), and Alex Pine (2L) competed in the St. Louis Regional, battling against teams from such schools as UCLA, San Diego, Faulkner, LSU, Loyola, Drake, Washington University, New Mexico, Chapman, Minnesota, MSU and Indiana. The team of Hillier / Franks / Pine just missed the semi-final break, while the team of Calve / George / DeBruyn made the break, defeating UCLA in the semi-finals and San Diego in the finals to be crowned Regional Champion. Mr. Calve was further honored with the designation as "Best Oral Advocate" of the St. Louis Regional. The win qualifies St. Mary's for the National Finals of the ABA NAAC in Chicago, and provides the team with the opportunity to defend last year's title of National Champion. Mr. Ricky J. Poole (JD, 90), coach of the moot court team, expressed his gratitude to the advocates: "All of these students worked extremely hard to prepare for this competition. I am honored to coach them and I am extremely proud of their accomplishments on behalf of their law school."

St. Mary's Moot Court Team Competes in "Best of the Best" National Championship

Last month, the EAP Moot Court Team participated in the Andrews Kurth Kenyon Moot Court National Championship, a moot court tournament held annually in Houston, Texas and open to the top sixteen (16) moot court programs in the country. **St. Mary's** qualified for this invitational through its recent designation as the **10th Best Moot Court Program** in the United States. The team of William "Billy" Calve (3L), Sophia George (2L), and Kathryn Kluge (2L) competed on behalf of the law school. **Mr. Calve** was recognized as the **Best Oral Advocate** at the tournament, beating out advocates from such programs as South Texas, Texas Tech, Stetson, Georgetown, University of Georgia, Chicago-Kent, Regent, UC Hastings and Baylor. Coach Poole congratulates the St. Mary's Moot Court Team, and Mr. Calve in particular, for their efforts: "Tournaments like this one simply confirm that St. Mary's continues to produce some of the best advocates in the nation. Our designation as a Top-10 Moot Court Program is a reflection of the commitment to advocacy displayed by St. Mary's on all levels, from administration to faculty to students. Mr. Calve's particular accomplishments are a tribute to his

immense natural talent and continued dedication and hard work. It is truly a joy to coach these fine students."

In the internship with Judge Bemporad, students may earn four graded credits in exchange for 240 hours of work. Successful candidates typically have a strong academic record.

Pass/Fail Credit Limitations

Students may not count toward graduation more than eight ungraded (pass/fail) elective credit hours earned at St. Mary's.

An application should include:

- (1) One federal court internship form, available from the Receptionist desk or on the law school website. (The form asks a student to indicate the judges to which the student is applying and the semesters the student is available to serve as an intern.)
- (2) For each judge by whom a candidate would like to be considered:
 - One resume, including cumulative GPA and current class rank;
 - One cover letter in business-letter format (return address, date, judge's address (see below), proper salutation (e.g., Dear Judge Prado), and signature. In terms of tone, the letter should be restrained, professional, factual, interesting, and confident;
 - Please staple the cover letter to the front of the resume. Please do not use special folders or bindings; they will be removed before the applications are sent to the judges.

Writing samples should not be included, except for the internship with Judge Bemporad.

Eligibility of Full-Time and Part-Time Students: Students may apply for any internship that will commence in a semester after the student has completed 30 hours of course work. Thus, a first-year full-time student may apply for an internship that will take place in the summer between first and second year, or during any subsequent semester. A first-year part-time student may apply for a judicial internship that commences in the spring of the student's second year or later.

- · 2 large peppers, seeded and thinly sliced
- 1 medium red onion, thinly sliced
- 2 tbsp. toasted sesame oil, divided
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 3 tbsp. soy sauce
- 2 tbsp. honey
- · 2 tsp. grated peeled fresh ginger
- 1/4 tsp. black pepper
- 4 fillets salmon (5 oz. each)
- 3 c. cooked brown rice
- · fresh basil, for garnish

- On large rimmed baking sheet, toss peppers with onion, 1 tablespoon sesame oil and salt. Roast in 425 degree F oven 20 minutes or until tender.

- 1 lemon
- 1 lb. skinless, boneless chicken-breast halves
- 3 tsp. extra virgin olive oil
- 1 small onion
- 2 large peppers (orange and yellow)
- ½ c. water
- salt
- pepper
- . 8 oz. sugar snap peas
- 1/2 c. Fresh dill
- To keep this lemony spring chicken dish lean and luscious, sear the meat in a little oil first, then just
 add water: It keeps the meat and vegetables from sticking to the pan and helps make a flavorful
 sauce.

Directions

 From lemon, grate 1 teaspoon peel; set aside. Into pie plate, squeeze 1 tablespoon juice. Add chicken; turn to coat.

2. In 12-inch skillet, heat 1 teaspoon oil on medium-high. Add onion, peppers, 2 tablespoons water, and 1/4 teaspoon each salt and freshly ground black pepper. Cook 3 minutes or until softened, stirring. Transfer to large plate.

3. In same skillet, heat 1 teaspoon oil on medium-high. Add peas, 2 tablespoons water, and 1/8 teaspoon each salt and black pepper. Cook 2 to 3 minutes or until beginning to brown, stirring

occasionally. Add to pepper mixture.

4. In same skillet, heat 1 teaspoon oil on medium-high. Add chicken; sprinkle with 1/4 teaspoon salt. Cook 3 minutes or until golden, stirring once. Return vegetables to pan; add remaining 1/4 cup water. Cook 1 minute or until saucy, stirring. Stir in dill, 1/4 teaspoon salt, and reserved peel.

These tender flounder fillets, seasoned with lemon slices and crushed croutons, make for a satisfying meal.

TOTAL TIME: 0:20

LEVEL: Easy

YIELD: 4 servings

Ingredients

- 1 1/4 lb. flounder filets
- · 1 medium lemon, thinly sliced
- · 3 tbsp. melted butter
- 1/2 c. Italian seasoned croutons
- · Chopped parsley, for garnish
- · Sautéed greens and dinner rolls for serving

Directions

- 1. In 3-quart baking dish, arrange flounder fillets in single layer; season with 1/4 teaspoon each salt and pepper. Top with lemon; drizzle with 3 tablespoons melted butter. Bake at 450°F 12 to 15 minutes, until fish just turns opaque in center.
- Pulse Italian- seasoned croutons in food processor until coarsely crushed; sprinkle over flounder. Garnish with chopped parsley. Serve with sautéed greens and dinner rolls.

Recipe of the week: Linguine with chickpeas and arugula

Ingredients

- 6 ounces whole-grain linguine or spaghetti
- 1/2 tablespoon olive or canola oil
- 1 cup fresh or frozen stir-fry vegetables (onions and green, red and yellow peppers), chopped
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 can (15 ounces) unsalted garbanzo beans, drained
- 1/4 teaspoon crushed red pepper
- · 1 lemon, juiced and zested
- 1 cup shredded Parmesan cheese
- 4 ounces (about 4 cups) arugula or baby spinach, coarsely chopped

Directions

Cook linguine for 5 minutes in boiling water. Drain, reserving 2 cups cooking water. In a large skillet, heat oil over medium-low heat. Add stir-fry vegetables and garlic. Cook for 3 minutes. Add the pasta, reserved cooking water, chickpeas, crushed red pepper, lemon zest and lemon juice to skillet. Cook for about 5 minutes or until the pasta is al dente. Remove pan from the heat and stir in the cheese and arugula or baby spinach. Toss to combine until arugula or baby spinach is wilted. Serve.

Recipe of the week: Salmon Noodle Bowl

- 4 ounces soba buckwheat noodles or whole-wheat spaghetti
- 5 ounces asparagus, cut in thirds
- Cooking spray
- 1 (6-oz) salmon fillet, skin off, cut into 8 pieces
- 1 tablespoon toasted sesame oil
- Zest and juice of 1-2 limes (3 TBSP juice)
- 1/4 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/4 teaspoon fresh pepper
- 4 ounces cucumber, skin on, cut into medium pieces
- 1/2 small avocado, cut into bite-size pieces

Preparation

- 1. Cook the noodles in boiling water until soft (about 6 minutes for soba, 8 for spaghetti). Transfer with tongs to a strainer. Add asparagus to same boiling water. Cook until al dente (about 2 minutes); rinse under cold water.
- 2. Heat a grill pan or skillet over medium-high heat. Coat lightly with cooking spray. Cook the salmon until cooked through, turning pieces (about 2-3 minutes per side). Reserve.
- 3. Make the vinaigrette: Whisk together sesame oil, lime zest and juice, and salt and pepper in a small bowl. Combine the noodles, asparagus, and vinaigrette in a medium serving bowl.
- 4. Add the cucumber and avocado; toss to coat. Just before serving, add salmon. Serve warm or at room temperature, or make up to 4 hours ahead and keep refrigerated in an airtight container.

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 lb. angel hair pasta
- 1 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 1 large carrot, peeled and chopped

- · 1 celery stalk, chopped
- · 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 lb. ground turkey
- kosher salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 1 28-ounce can crushed tomatoes
- 1/2 c. dry white or red wine
- 1/4 c. freshly chopped parsley, plus more for garnish
- 2 tsp. dried oregano
- freshly grated Parmesan, for serving

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. In a large pot of salted boiling water, cook angel hair according to package directions until al dente. Drain and return to pot.
