# **Pro Bono Program**

#### Community Service Requirement: Updates

All JD students who matriculate in Fall 2018 or later are required to complete thirty (30) hours of service before graduation. Students must complete at least ten (10) hours toward the 30 hour requirement before the end of their first year of law school and at least twenty (20) hours before the end of their second year of law school.

No more than fifteen (15) of the service hours may be general community service hours with a qualifying non-profit or public entity. At least fifteen (15) hours must be law school-approved hours.

#### **Deadline Adjustment**

First-year students who completed the 29 credit hours of the first-year curriculum this spring or summer will now have until October 1, 2020 to complete the 10-hour community service requirement.

Second-year students who completed 60 credit hours this past spring or summer will also have until October 1, 2020 to complete the 20-hour community service requirement. Note that at least five (5) of those hours are required to be law-related, as defined in the *Student Handbook*.







# **Pro Bono Program**

#### Community Service Requirement: Updates

All JD students who matriculate in Fall 2018 or later are required to complete thirty (30) hours of service before graduation. Students must complete at least ten (10) hours toward the 30 hour requirement before the end of their first year of law school and at least twenty (20) hours before the end of their second year of law school.

No more than fifteen (15) of the service hours may be general community service hours with a qualifying non-profit or public entity. At least fifteen (15) hours must be law school-approved hours.

#### **Deadline Adjustment**

Current second-year students (those who have completed 29 credit hours) will now have until October 1, 2020 to complete the 10-hour community service requirement.

Current third-year students (those who completed 60 credit hours this past spring or summer) will also have until October 1, 2020 to complete the 20-hour community service requirement. Note that at least five (5) of those hours are required to be law-related, as defined in the *Student Handbook*.





# **Pro Bono Program**

### Community Service Requirement: Updates

All JD students who matriculate in Fall 2018 or later are required to complete thirty (30) hours of service before graduation. Students must complete at least ten (10) hours toward the 30 hour requirement before the end of their first year of law school and at least twenty (20) hours before the end of their second year of law school.

No more than fifteen (15) of the service hours may be general community service hours with a qualifying non-profit or public entity. At least fifteen (15) hours must be law school-approved hours.

### **Deadline Adjustment**

Current second-year students (those who have completed 29 credit hours) will now have until October 1, 2020 to complete the 10-hour community service requirement.

Current third-year students (those who completed 60 credit hours this past spring or summer) will also have until October 1, 2020 to complete the 20-hour community service requirement. Note that at least five (5) of those hours are required to be law-related, as defined in the *Student Handbook*.

# **Pro Bono Program**

#### Community Service Requirement: Updates

All JD students who matriculate in Fall 2018 or later are required to complete thirty (30) hours of service before graduation. Students must complete at least ten (10) hours toward the 30 hour requirement before the end of their first year of law school and at least twenty (20) hours before the end of their second year of law school.

No more than fifteen (15) of the service hours may be general community service hours with a qualifying non-profit or public entity. At least fifteen (15) hours must be law school-approved hours.

#### **Deadline Adjustment**

Current second-year students (those who have completed 29 credit hours) will now have until October 1, 2020 to complete the 10-hour community service requirement.

Current third-year students (those who completed 60 credit hours this past spring or summer) will also have until October 1, 2020 to complete the 20-hour community service requirement. Note that at least five (5) of those hours are required to be law-related, as defined in the *Student Handbook*.

#### **Disclosure of Character and Fitness Issues**

This disclosure is made to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. Students must disclose any matter that affects character and fitness in a timely manner, close in time the incident that may affect issues of character and fitness to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs.

A character and fitness addendum must include a full accounting of the circumstances surrounding and current disposition of the motivating event. The addendum must be submitted with the date and the student's original or electronic signature. It is the student's responsibility to update the Texas Board of Law Examiners or any other state bar licensing agency where the student intends to apply for admission of any amendments made to the law school. ## **Pro Bono Program**

#### Community Service Requirement: Updates

All JD students who matriculate in Fall 2018 or later are required to complete thirty (30) hours of service before graduation. Students must complete at least ten (10) hours toward the 30 hour requirement before the end of their first year of law school and at least twenty (20) hours before the end of their second year of law school.

No more than fifteen (15) of the service hours may be general community service hours with a qualifying non-profit or public entity. At least fifteen (15) hours must be law school-approved hours.

#### **Deadline Adjustment**

Current second-year students (those who have completed 29 credit hours) will now have until **October 1, 2020** to complete the 10-hour community service requirement.

Current third-year students (those who completed 60 credit hours this past spring or summer) will also have until **October 1, 2020** to complete the 20-hour community service requirement. Note that at least five (5) of those hours are required to be law-related, as defined in the *Student Handbook*.

# **St. Mary's Moot Court Team Takes Second Place at CRAL** National Moot Competition

Fresh off of a national moot court championship last weekend, the St. Mary's Moot Court Team competed in the 14th Annual Civil Rights and Liberties (CRAL) National Moot Court Competition, sponsored by Emory Law School in Atlanta, Georgia. The competition involves cutting edge issues of constitutional and statutory law. National Moot Court Team members Nicole Cooper (3L), Meredith Milton (2L) and Evan Santos (2L) participated on behalf of St. Mary's, competing against 31 other schools from all over the United States. St. Mary's went undefeated in the preliminary rounds, and reached the Finals of the competition, before losing a hard fought championship round to George Washington University School of Law and placing second overall. Fifth Circuit Judge Catharina Haynes was one of three federal judges representing the fictional 13th Circuit Court of Appeals in the Final Round. Judge Haynes, who had also judged St. Mary's Finals win last week at the Hassell National Moot Court Competition, declared after the names of the two finalist law schools were announced: "St. Mary's seems to be orally arguing the world." This is the second straight year that the St. Mary's National Moot Court Team has reached the final round of the CRAL competition, having won the competition just last year. In addition to reaching the Finals, Meredith Milton was recognized as having a Top-10 brief and Nicole Cooper and Evan Santos were both designated Top-10 oralists. 





# News from the Best Advocacy Program

### St. Mary's Moot Court Team Places Second - Wins Individual Accolades

Over the weekend, the St. Mary's National Moot Court Team participated in the Mack Kidd Administrative Law State Moot Court Competition, sponsored by the Administrative Law Section of the State Bar of Texas. Mack Kidd is one of two state moot court competitions, and is open to all accredited law schools in the State of Texas. St. Mary's fielded three teams this year: (1) Melissa Fullmer (3L) and Coy Westbrook (2L); (2) Daniela Virgen (2L), Angela Bauman (2L) and Nicole Thacker (2L); and (3) Rachel Garza (3L), Sarah Garcia (2L) and Dominique Bernal (2L). **The team of Garza/Garcia/Bernal reached the semi-finals of the competition, while Fullmer/Westbrook competed in the Final Round.** St. Mary's finished second to Baylor, after having unseated Baylor in the Final Round last year. **Sarah Garcia won Best Brief at the tournament, while Melissa Fullmer took home both Second Best Brief and Second Best Oral Advocate.** This is the third consecutive week that the St. Mary's National Moot Court Team has reached the finals or better of a competition. As a result of the efforts of these amazing advocates, St. Mary's Moot is currently ranked the **Best Advocacy Program in the Nation.** Congratulations to all of these exceptional students!

### St. Mary's National Trial Team Fights to Three-Way Tie. Meagan Ledesma Wins Best Advocate

The National Team has been busy the past few weeks. This past weekend, The National Trial Team participated in the 3rd Annual Battle of Experts in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Team 3L's Joseph Casseb, Cameron Galvan, Zachary Green and Meagan Ledesma fought their way to a three-way tie in their division, needing to go to the fourth tie-breaker. UCLA won the tiebreaker, eventually winning the tournament with the final round judged by our very own Professor Jason Goss, who was selected by the teams to be the Presiding Judge for the final round. Meagan Ledesma, in her first competition as an advocate won the coveted Best Advocate Award. We are very proud of all of our National Team members and the way they represent St. Mary's School Law School.

### St. Mary's Hosts Largest Ever Invitational Mock Trial Tournament

Over the course of the last two weekends. St. Mary's has been host to the nation's largest mock trial tournament. Inspired by the loss of opportunities to our students and to students around the country, St. Mary's School of Law Board of Advocates (BOA) partnered with six other schools to bring the 2020 All Star National Bracket Challenge. This 64 team tournament will be joined by a 34 team tournament in early November. Together, this tournament brought in 98 teams from half of the ABA approved law schools in 34 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico. The Bracket Challenge mimicked the NCAA Final Four tournament with the winning team needing to win eight rounds in order to be crowned the National Champion. The BOA hosted over 550 attorneys and judges in 143 trials over 490 hours in six days. This is a remarkable feat that could not have been accomplished without the sacrifice of the BOA. The team from Stetson University won the tournament.





All JD students who matriculate in Fall 2018 or later are required to complete thirty (30) hours of service before graduation. It is the student's responsibility to update the Texas Board of Law Examiners or any other state bar licensing agency where the student intends to apply for admission of any amendments made to the law school. 



All JD students who matriculate in Fall 2018 or later are required to complete thirty (30) hours of service before graduation. 



### Community Service Requirement: Updates

All JD students who matriculate in Fall 2018 or later are required to complete thirty (30) hours of service before graduation. ## Notices

#### **Disclosure of Character and Fitness Issues**

Students are required to disclose, in writing, any new or additional information, or changes to any matters affecting character and fitness not included in the students' application or occurring during their legal studies. This disclosure is made to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. Students must disclose any matter that affects character and fitness in a timely manner, close in time the incident that may affect issues of character and fitness to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs.

A character and fitness addendum must include a full accounting of the circumstances surrounding and current disposition of the motivating event. The addendum must be submitted with the date and the student's original or electronic signature. It is the student's responsibility to update the Texas Board of Law Examiners or any other state bar licensing agency where the student intends to apply for admission of any amendments made to the law school. 



#### Community Service Requirement: Updates

All JD students who matriculate in Fall 2018 or later are required to complete thirty (30) hours of service before graduation. #### Community Service Requirement: Updates

All JD students who matriculate in Fall 2018 or later are required to complete thirty (30) hours of service before graduation. Students must complete at least ten (10) hours toward the 30 hour requirement before the end of their first year of law school and at least twenty (20) hours before the end of their second year of law school.

#### **Disclosure of Character and Fitness Issues**

Students are required to disclose, in writing, any new or additional information, or changes to any matters affecting character and fitness not included in the students' application or occurring during their legal studies. This disclosure is made to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. Students must disclose any matter that affects character and fitness in a timely manner, close in time the incident that may affect issues of character and fitness to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs.

A character and fitness addendum must include a full accounting of the circumstances surrounding and current disposition of the motivating event. The addendum must be submitted with the date and the student's original or electronic signature. It is the student's responsibility to update the Texas Board of Law Examiners or any other state bar licensing agency where the student intends to apply for admission of any amendments made to the law school. For more information students should refer to the Law *Student Handbook*, Section XI, Bar Examination Information.

#### **Registered Student Organizations (RSO)**

All Law RSO events must be virtual events whether on or off campus. All events must be entered into RattlerTracks for approval by the Office of the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. There are no exceptions to this policy.

#### Veterans

Veterans in the San Antonio area who are in the Veteran Health Care System have two options for receiving the vaccination from the VA:

- 1. They may call and schedule an appointment for the vaccine, the phone number is 210-949-9702. (Highly recommended.)
- 2. They may do the walk-in option on Saturdays for the vaccine.

#### San Antonio

For individuals who currently fall into the categories 1A & 1B:

The city of San Antonio (San Antonio Metro Health) is offering Covid vaccines via mass vaccination events. Registration is required ahead of time either online <u>here</u> or by calling 311. The website states residents can check back during the week for later appointments.

University Health System is also offering the vaccine for the same group of individuals, depending on vaccine availability. Information can be found <u>here</u> for that program. UHS's app will notify residents when more appointments become available.

#### Outside San Antonio

The Texas Department of State Health Services has a Covid-19 information page <u>here</u> which includes this <u>map</u>. Students should be able to place their ZIP code into the interactive map to see if there is any availability in their area.





Last weekend, six members of the National ADR Team dominated the competition scoring top scores in each round. The six competitors not only conquered the weather, but nearly the entire field of competitors. This was an incredible showing from our National ADR Team in which two of the three teams advanced to the semifinals. After preliminary rounds, Claire Mikita and Stafford Sadler and Skyler Grau and Charles Hosey were #1 and #3 in the entire tournament. Further, Claire Mikita and Stafford Sadler held the highest scores going into the semifinals and finals round, and were crowned regional finalists. The team's hard work and dedication were the driving force of the readiness, and their mastery of the medium was on full display. #### National Trial Team has Best Finish in Nearly a Decade at the National Trial Competition

Last weekend, the St. Mary's University School of Law National Trial Team competed in the Regional National Trial Competition (NTC), which was hosted by the University of Texas and Texas Southern Law School. St. Mary's brought two teams to compete this year, the Blue Team, consisting of 3L's Meagan Ledesma and Juishree Samant, and the Gold Team, consisting of 3L's Rebecca Dettmers and Cameron Galvan, and 2L Andrea Vizcarra. The National Trial team is ready to take the competition again next year.

This was possible because of a huge team effort. 2L's Anne Baumgardner, Robin Becker, Kenneth Ferguson, Hailey Nikkels, Jasmin Olguin, Stephanie Swanson, John Sydow and Carin Weiters helped prepare the team by playing the roles of either practice squad or witnesses. As a result of their preparations, 2L's Anne "Brooke" Baumgardner, Hailey Nikkels and Jasmine Olguin volunteered to compete as a foil team during the winter snowpocalypse this past week, finishing 1 point shy of breaking to the semi-final round in Region 8. Many of these members along with 3L Cameron Galvan volunteered to witness several rounds when teams could not provide their own witnesses due to the weather. This service has been noticed by the advocacy nationwide with praise coming from around the country. Congratulations to all!

#### Community Service Requirement: Updates

All JD students who matriculate in Fall 2018 or later are required to complete thirty (30) hours of service before graduation. Students must complete at least ten (10) hours toward the 30 hour requirement before the end of their first year of law school and at least twenty (20) hours before the end of their second year of law school.

#### **Disclosure of Character and Fitness Issues**

Students are required to disclose, in writing, any new or additional information, or changes to any matters affecting character and fitness not included in the students' application or occurring during their legal studies. This disclosure is made to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. Students must disclose any matter that affects character and fitness in a timely manner, close in time the incident that may affect issues of character and fitness to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs.

A character and fitness addendum must include a full accounting of the circumstances surrounding and current disposition of the motivating event. The addendum must be submitted with the date and the student's original or electronic signature. It is the student's responsibility to update the Texas Board of Law Examiners or any other state bar licensing agency where the student intends to apply for admission of any amendments made to the law school. # **St. Mary's National Moot Court Team Reaches ABA NAAC Regional Finals, Receives Individual Awards As Well**

#### Community Service Requirement: Updates

All JD students who matriculate in Fall 2018 or later are required to complete thirty (30) hours of service before graduation. 



The pair secured the best score in the entire tournament. With a near-perfect score, Monique and Tyler set the tone for the entire team for the competition. Tied with the most winning ballots, Team Captains Claire Mikita and Skyler Grau swept the competition and showcased their mediation expertise in both rounds. Most impressively, with a last-minute opportunity to add a team the day before the competition, Hunter Dennehy and Valerie Desrosiers stepped in and conquered the competition having had only one day to prepare and fearlessly finishing as the top two teams in the preliminary rounds. Hunter Dennehy, Valerie Desrosiers, Skyler Grau, and Claire Mikita placed in the top four as we moved to the final round. Valerie Desrosiers and Claire Mikita battled it out in the finals, and were ultimately crowned regional finalists. The National ADR coach, Professor Emily Landon, noted "I am extremely proud how the National ADR team continues to show the country how talented they are in the burgeoning field of ADR." Congratulations to the entire ADR team, the competitors, and to Professor Emily Landon on an astounding finish.

## National Trial Team Crowned Regional Semi-Finalist in Prestigious American Association of Justice National Trial Competition:

Two National Trial Teams competed this weekend in the Central 5 Region of the AAJ Trial Competition via Zoom. The AAJ competition is a National Tournament hosted by the American Association of Justice. The 3L team of **Peter Caldarola**, **Joseph Casseb**, **Zachary Green** and **Edward Villarreal** competed in three rounds against Washburn University, Marquette and Texas A&M. They finished the weekend tied for fourth place but missing the break by points. The 2L team of **Ethan Bannister**, **Cassidi Dietz**, **Emily Fey** and **Richard Hansen** competed in three rounds against Loyola (Chicago), University of Arkansas (Little Rock) and Alabama, also finishing the preliminary rounds in third place and breaking to the semi-finals against University of Missouri-Kansas City, after a very close semi-final round. Head Coach Jason Goss, Coach Deb Junek and Coach Maritza Stewart commented on how far these teams have grown and how our 3L team is laying the foundation for our 2Ls to be even better next year.

"I could not be happier with the success of the program right now" said Director of Advocacy Professor A.J. Bellido de Luna. "In one weekend, all of our teams advanced to the semi-final or final rounds. I do not know if that has ever happened before and I think it is a sign of even bigger accomplishments to come." Professor A.J. praised the coaches for their dedication and the students hard work and is looking forward to inviting our 1L class to try out for the National Team after the 1L competition is complete. "We have a level of consistency making the breaks now. As we continue to improve, we look forward to putting more championship hardware in our trophy cases. The rising 2L's have big shoes to fill."


### Federal Court Judicial Internships in San Antonio



## Community Service Requirement: Updates

All JD students who matriculate in Fall 2018 or later are required to complete thirty (30) hours of service before graduation. Students must complete at least ten (10) hours toward the 30 hour requirement before the end of their first year of law school and at least twenty (20) hours before the end of their second year of law school.

No more than fifteen (15) of the service hours may be general community service hours with a qualifying non-profit or public entity. At least fifteen (15) hours must be law school-approved hours.



## Notices

#### **Disclosure of Character and Fitness Issues**

Students are required to disclose, in writing, any new or additional information, or changes to any matters affecting character and fitness not included in the students' application or occurring during their legal studies. This disclosure is made to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. Students must disclose any matter that affects character and fitness in a timely manner, close in time the incident that may affect issues of character and fitness to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs.

A character and fitness addendum must include a full accounting of the circumstances surrounding and current disposition of the motivating event. The addendum must be submitted with the date and the student's original or electronic signature. It is the student's responsibility to update the Texas Board of Law Examiners or any other state bar licensing agency where the student intends to apply for admission of any amendments made to the law school. For more information students should refer to the Law *Student Handbook*, Section XI, Bar Examination Information.

#### **Registered Student Organizations (RSO)**

All Law RSO events must be virtual events whether on or off campus. All events must be entered into RattlerTracks for approval by the Office of the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. There are no exceptions to this policy.

## Community Service Requirement: Updates

All JD students who matriculate in Fall 2018 or later are required to complete thirty (30) hours of service before graduation. Students must complete at least ten (10) hours toward the 30 hour requirement before the end of their first year of law school and at least twenty (20) hours before the end of their second year of law school.

No more than fifteen (15) of the service hours may be general community service hours with a qualifying non-profit or public entity. At least fifteen (15) hours must be law school-approved hours.

## **Disclosure of Character and Fitness Issues**

Students are required to disclose, in writing, any new or additional information, or changes to any matters affecting character and fitness not included in the students' application or occurring during their legal studies. This disclosure is made to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. Students must disclose any matter that affects character and fitness in a timely manner, close in time the incident that may affect issues of character and fitness to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs.

A character and fitness addendum must include a full accounting of the circumstances surrounding and current disposition of the motivating event. The addendum must be submitted with the date and the student's original or electronic signature. It is the student's responsibility to update the Texas Board of Law Examiners or any other state bar licensing agency where the student intends to apply for admission of any amendments made to the law school. 



# **St. Mary's Moot Court Team Top-8 Finish at National Competition/Individual Awards and Team Recognition**

This past weekend, the St. Mary's National Moot Court Team competed in the 28th Annual John R. Brown Admiralty Law National Moot Court Competition. The tournament included 29 teams from law schools all over the country, and the argument focused on cutting edge issues in the field of admiralty law.

This was the first time that St. Mary's had ever competed in this tournament, which was held remotely via Zoom this year. St. Mary's fielded two teams at the competition: Melissa Fullmer (3L) and Nicole Cooper (3L) and Evan Santos (2L), Sarah Garcia (2L) and Nicole Thacker (2L). The team of **Fullmer and Cooper reached the quarter-final round of the competition**, winning three of the four judges' ballots but losing the round by a narrow margin on brief. **Fullmer and Cooper** were further recognized as both the **Best Newcomer Team** at the competition and the **3rd Best Team on oral arguments**. The team of **Santos, Garcia and Thacker** were the **4th Best Team on oral arguments**. **Fullmer and Santos** were additionally recognized individually, tying for **3rd Best Oral Advocate** at this competition.

## South Texas Challenge

The St. Mary's National Trial Team competed this week in the South Texas Challenge, a National Invitational Mock Trial Tournament attended by the best trial teams in the country. Representing St. Mary's as advocates were 3L and Team Captain Rebecca Dettmers and 2L Andrea Vizcarra. 2L's Robin Becker and Stephanie Swanson competed with the team as a witness and Stephanie was the team's lead author for the writing component of the competition. 



## **Pro Bono Program**

#### Community Service Requirement: Updates

All JD students who matriculate in Fall 2018 or later are required to complete thirty (30) hours of service before graduation. Students must complete at least ten (10) hours toward the 30 hour requirement before the end of their first year of law school and at least twenty (20) hours before the end of their second year of law school.

No more than fifteen (15) of the service hours may be general community service hours with a qualifying non-profit or public entity. At least fifteen (15) hours must be law school-approved hours.

## Notices

#### **Disclosure of Character and Fitness Issues**

Students are required to disclose, in writing, any new or additional information, or changes to any matters affecting character and fitness not included in the students' application or occurring during their legal studies. This disclosure is made to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. Students must disclose any matter that affects character and fitness in a timely manner, close in time the incident that may affect issues of character and fitness to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs.

A character and fitness addendum must include a full accounting of the circumstances surrounding and current disposition of the motivating event. The addendum must be submitted with the date and the student's original or electronic signature. It is the student's responsibility to update the Texas Board of Law Examiners or any other state bar licensing agency where the student intends to apply for admission of any amendments made to the law school. For more information students should refer to the Law *Student Handbook*, Section XI, Bar Examination Information.

#### **Registered Student Organizations (RSO)**

All Law RSO events must be virtual events whether on or off campus. All events must be entered into RattlerTracks for approval by the Office of the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. There are no exceptions to this policy.







#### Community Service Requirement: Updates

All JD students who matriculate in Fall 2018 or later are required to complete thirty (30) hours of service before graduation. Students must complete at least ten (10) hours toward the 30 hour requirement before the end of their first year of law school and at least twenty (20) hours before the end of their second year of law school.

No more than fifteen (15) of the service hours may be general community service hours with a qualifying non-profit or public entity. At least fifteen (15) hours must be law school-approved hours.

**Disclosure of Character and Fitness Issues** 

Students are required to disclose, in writing, any new or additional information, or changes to any matters affecting character and fitness not included in the students' application or occurring during their legal studies. This disclosure is made to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. Students must disclose any matter that affects character and fitness in a timely manner, close in time the incident that may affect issues of character and fitness to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs.

A character and fitness addendum must include a full accounting of the circumstances surrounding and current disposition of the motivating event. The addendum must be submitted with the date and the student's original or electronic signature. It is the student's responsibility to update the Texas Board of Law Examiners or any other state bar licensing agency where the student intends to apply for admission of any amendments made to the law school. 

#### Community Service Requirement: Updates

All JD students who matriculate in Fall 2018 or later are required to complete thirty (30) hours of service before graduation. Students must complete at least ten (10) hours toward the 30 hour requirement before the end of their first year of law school and at least twenty (20) hours before the end of their second year of law school.

No more than fifteen (15) of the service hours may be general community service hours with a qualifying non-profit or public entity. At least fifteen (15) hours must be law school-approved hours.

#### **Disclosure of Character and Fitness Issues**

Students are required to disclose, in writing, any new or additional information, or changes to any matters affecting character and fitness not included in the students' application or occurring during their legal studies. This disclosure is made to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. Students must disclose any matter that affects character and fitness in a timely manner, close in time the incident that may affect issues of character and fitness to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs.

A character and fitness addendum must include a full accounting of the circumstances surrounding and current disposition of the motivating event. The addendum must be submitted with the date and the student's original or electronic signature. It is the student's responsibility to update the Texas Board of Law Examiners or any other state bar licensing agency where the student intends to apply for admission of any amendments made to the law school. 



Calling All May Graduates! All JD students who matriculated in August 2018 or later must record a minimum of 30 service hours, at least 15 of which must be law-related, to satisfy the community service graduation requirement. Additionally, JD students who complete 100 hours

### **Community Service Reporting Deadline for Continuing JD Students**

Rising second-year students (those who will have completed the first 29 credit hours of the JD program by this fall) will have until August 18, 2021 to satisfy the 10-hour community service requirement.

Rising third-year students (those who will have completed 60 credit hours of the JD program by this fall) will also have until August 18, 2021 to complete the 20-hour community service requirement. Note that at least five (5) of those hours are required to be law-related, as defined in the Student Handbook.



#### Community Service Requirement: Updates

All JD students who matriculate in Fall 2018 or later are required to complete thirty (30) hours of service before graduation. Students must complete at least ten (10) hours toward the 30 hour requirement before the end of their first year of law school and at least twenty (20) hours before the end of their second year of law school.

No more than fifteen (15) of the service hours may be general community service hours with a qualifying non-profit or public entity. At least fifteen (15) hours must be law school-approved hours.

#### **Disclosure of Character and Fitness Issues**

Students are required to disclose, in writing, any new or additional information, or changes to any matters affecting character and fitness not included in the students' application or occurring during their legal studies. This disclosure is made to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. Students must disclose any matter that affects character and fitness in a timely manner, close in time the incident that may affect issues of character and fitness to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs.

A character and fitness addendum must include a full accounting of the circumstances surrounding and current disposition of the motivating event. The addendum must be submitted with the date and the student's original or electronic signature. It is the student's responsibility to update the Texas Board of Law Examiners or any other state bar licensing agency where the student intends to apply for admission of any amendments made to the law school. For more information students should refer to the Law *Student Handbook*, Section XI, Bar Examination Information.

#### **Registered Student Organizations (RSO)**

All Law RSO events must be virtual events whether on or off campus. All events must be entered into RattlerTracks for approval by the Office of the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. There are no exceptions to this policy.



All JD students who matriculated in August 2018 or later must record a minimum of 30 service hours, at least 15 of which must be law-related, to satisfy the community service graduation requirement. Additionally, JD students who complete 100 hours of law-related service, community service, or any combination thereof will be recognized at graduation for their commitment to service.

### **Community Service Reporting Deadline for Continuing JD Students**

Rising third-year students (those who will have completed 60 credit hours of the JD program by this fall) will also have until August 18, 2021 to complete the 20-hour community service requirement. Note that at least five (5) of those hours are required to be law-related, as defined in the Student Handbook.



# **Pro Bono Program**

#### Community Service Requirement: Updates

All JD students who matriculate in Fall 2018 or later are required to complete thirty (30) hours of service before graduation. Students must complete at least ten (10) hours toward the 30 hour requirement before the end of their first year of law school and at least twenty (20) hours before the end of their second year of law school.

No more than fifteen (15) of the service hours may be general community service hours with a qualifying non-profit or public entity. At least fifteen (15) hours must be law school-approved hours.

#### **Disclosure of Character and Fitness Issues**

Students are required to disclose, in writing, any new or additional information, or changes to any matters affecting character and fitness not included in the students' application or occurring during their legal studies. This disclosure is made to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. Students must disclose any matter that affects character and fitness in a timely manner, close in time the incident that may affect issues of character and fitness to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs.

A character and fitness addendum must include a full accounting of the circumstances surrounding and current disposition of the motivating event. The addendum must be submitted with the date and the student's original or electronic signature. It is the student's responsibility to update the Texas Board of Law Examiners or any other state bar licensing agency where the student intends to apply for admission of any amendments made to the law school. For more information students should refer to the Law *Student Handbook*, Section XI, Bar Examination Information.

#### **Registered Student Organizations (RSO)**

All Law RSO events must be virtual events whether on or off campus. All events must be entered into RattlerTracks for approval by the Office of the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. There are no exceptions to this policy.



Preparation for the bar exam alone is stressful enough. Uncertainty regarding living expenses only adds to this stress. Do you find yourself having to deal with both of these this summer? If so, we have an opportunity for you.



### **Spring 2021 Final Exams**

Information on upcoming final exams is listed below. The final exam procedures and exam schedule is also available in the below PDF attachments.

#### Anonymous Exam PIN Numbers

Each student is given a four-digit anonymous exam number each semester, which is the ONLY student identification placed on examination responses.

Students should access their exam PIN number on Gateway, either via "LAUNCHPAD" then "LAW" and "Law Student Pin," or using the "LAW" tab at the top right, then below "Related Links," "Exam Pin Number" and click on "View My Pin." A student who does not see the exam number should contact the University's IT department <u>helpdesk@stmarytx.edu</u> or 210-431-4357 to correct the problem.

The use of an incorrect exam number on a final exam may cause the student not to receive a grade, as the professor will be unable to reconcile the grade with the correct anonymous exam number. A student who uses an incorrect exam number should contact Ms. Yvonne Olfers <u>volfers@stmarytx.edu</u> and provide the course name and professor, incorrect exam number used, and student ID#.

#### Exam Schedule

The exam schedule shows the exam administration for each course during the two-week exam period, including room assignments for in-person exams. This schedule is also posted on Gateway. Students should confirm information on the format of their exam (In-person, Examplify-remote, or Dropbox) from each individual professor.

#### Using ExamSoft/Examplify to Laptop Exam Answers

For in-person exams that will allow students to laptop their answers, and for remote Examplify exams, students MUST have <u>the latest version of Softest from ExamSoft/Examplify</u> downloaded on the laptop the students will use for exams. <u>Students are required to take a</u> practice test prior to the exam period, and may take a practice test multiple times.

#### **Dropbox Links**

If your final exam has a Dropbox submission, as determined by your professor, you will receive an email from Ms. Yvonne Olfers, Director of Student Records, prior to the start of the exam period that will contain the link. Please review this email on how to prepare and upload your exam answers, which must be as PDF.

#### **Examplify Passcodes**

If your final exam will be administered via Examplify Remote, as determined by your professor, you will need a unique passcode to access your exam on the posted day and time of your test. Ms. Olfers will email the passcode approximately 5 minutes before the start of the exam to your St. Mary's University email account. Be sure to check both your Inbox and Junk folder for receipt of that message.

#### Posting Spring 2021 Grades

No grades are posted during the exam period (May 10 - 21). Any faculty grades submitted during this time period will be posted on Gateway beginning Monday, May 24, 2021. The grading deadline for faculty to submit their grades is 5:00 p.m., Friday, June 18, 2021. Grades are reviewed to ensure they meet the grade rules before being posted. Once posted, students can view their individual grades on Gateway, "LAUNCHPAD," "STUDENTS," "My Student Profile" then "View Grades" underneath the student's ID picture.

Rising third-year students (those who will have completed 60 credit hours of the JD program by this fall) will also have until August 18, 2021 to complete the 20-hour community service requirement. Note that at least five (5) of those hours are required to be law-related, as defined in the Student Handbook.



### **Pro Bono Program**

#### Community Service Requirement: Updates

All JD students who matriculate in Fall 2018 or later are required to complete thirty (30) hours of service before graduation. Students must complete at least ten (10) hours toward the 30 hour requirement before the end of their first year of law school and at least twenty (20) hours before the end of their second year of law school.

No more than fifteen (15) of the service hours may be general community service hours with a qualifying non-profit or public entity. At least fifteen (15) hours must be law school-approved hours.

#### **Disclosure of Character and Fitness Issues**

Students are required to disclose, in writing, any new or additional information, or changes to any matters affecting character and fitness not included in the students' application or occurring during their legal studies. This disclosure is made to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs. Students must disclose any matter that affects character and fitness in a timely manner, close in time the incident that may affect issues of character and fitness to the Assistant Dean for Law Student Affairs.

A character and fitness addendum must include a full accounting of the circumstances surrounding and current disposition of the motivating event. The addendum must be submitted with the date and the student's original or electronic signature. It is the student's responsibility to update the Texas Board of Law Examiners or any other state bar licensing agency where the student intends to apply for admission of any amendments made to the law school. For more information students should refer to the Law *Student Handbook*, Section XI, Bar Examination Information.


