



#### Message from the President



Dear Alumni and Friends of St. Mary's:

On Sept. 10, 1999, I announced to the St. Mary's Board of Trustees that I will not seek a fifth term as president and, further, the board granted my requested leave of absence that became effective Oct. 26, 1999. I appreciate the board's willingness to give me some time to plan my future with the provincial authorities and to take a retreat.

Please join me in welcoming Charles, L. Cotrell, Ph.D., as the acting president. Charlie

is no stranger to St. Mary's. He received his bachelor's and master's degrees in political science at St. Mary's, earned his doctorate from the University of Arizona, and began his teaching career back here in 1966. Since then, he has served as department chairman, graduate program director, dean of the School of Humanities and Social Sciences, assistant to the president for planning and institutional research and, for the past 13 years, as vice president for academic affairs.

Charlie and I have worked closely over the past 11 years, and I have great confidence in his ability to carry forward the business of leading the University. His more than 30 years of experience at St. Mary's makes me feel very comfortable in taking a leave to explore my future directions.

Twelve years is a long time in the life of a president, and we have accomplished much over these years. Clearly these are not my personal achievements, but those of the University community as a whole. I think of the inauguration of the Lin Great Speakers Series, through which we bring nationally renowned speakers to campus. I think of the development of the first doctoral program in counseling offered by a four-year institution in San Antonio, and of the accreditation of the School of Business and Administration. I think of our stepping up to NCAA Division II status for intercollegiate athletics, and of our winning a national basketball championship. I think of the construction of the University Center and three residence halls, with a fourth now under construction. I think of the increased alumni scholarship endowment which is nearly \$5 million, and of our permanent endowment which is now more than \$72 million.

I think of the opening of the Center for Legal and Social Justice at the School of Law, home of the burgeoning clinical programs, and the new LL.M. programs. I think of the completion of our most successful capital campaign, raising over \$15 million for the Athletics Convocation Center. And I think of our success in achieving the \$2.1 million dollar grant to integrate advanced educational technology into faculty teaching and student learning. I think of the establishment of new alumni chapters and the reconnect receptions in major cities throughout the country.

I think of record enrollments reaching 4,200 and solid graduation and retention rates and alumni success, and the growing international consciousness represented by our semester abroad programs. I think of convocations where we've grappled with the "Characteristics of Marianist Universities" and "Ex corde Ecclesiae" documents, and of our efforts to build on our Marianist spirit. And I think of all the people who made it happen – trustees, Marianists, faculty, staff and students, our alumni, benefactors and friends – those who have gone before us and those who will come after us.

Announcing my decision now gives the board sufficient time to conduct a presidential search in conjunction with the Marianist Provincial Administration. The national search, which is under way, will actively pursue professed Marianist candidates as well as qualified lay candidates. The search committee hopes to have the new president in place June 1, 2000.

These years have been rich ones for me personally and I think good years for the University as well. Thanks to all of you for everything you have done for St. Mary's. We are blessed to be part of a great University with a great mission of education. Let us continue to be worthy of that blessing.



hen I came to St. Mary's University in 1958 after graduating from Ursuline Academy, the Rev. James Young, S.M., "Father Jim"

to most, was academic vice president and dean of faculty. St. Mary's was a small community, and through the years I had the pleasure of knowing him as a friend and mentor, although I did not work for him until the final three years of his presidency, 1978 to 1981.

#### IN THE AUTUMN OF LIFE

The sun cast a golden glow on the front of St. Louis Hall one recent morning as I arrived at the St. Mary's campus. The mellowness of the autumn sunlight reminded me of the passing years because Father Jim and I would meet later that day to talk of his remembrances of his time spent at St. Mary's. Almost one third of his 66 years of religious life have been at the University.

Visiting at the Marianist Residence where he is retired, Father Jim spoke of the important moments in his long life of service to education. In the final chapter of his life now, he fondly speaks of the relationships he built with trustees, business leaders, students, alumni, faculty and staff. His face lights up as he talks enthusiastically about the construction of the new Athletics Convocation Center, the fulfillment of a dream that began long ago.

#### ACADEMIC BLUEPRINT MAPS ST. MARY'S FUTURE

Father Young's early vision for St. Mary's educational excellence began in the late 1950s when he was academic vice president. He drafted his "Academic Blueprint," which mapped out plans for the University's future in and out of the classroom. An essential campus component was a major convocation center that could accommodate the needs of a growing

university – the needs of a university Father Jim knew St. Mary's could become.

For his blueprint to work. Father Jim had to get many constituencies to feel ownership of long-range planning. Of his many gifts, that of consensus-builder enabled him to engage often disparate groups in meaningful, productive discussions about what was best for St. Mary's.

So, the dream and the planning began and continued through his presidency. Although the Athletics Convocation

Center Father Young envisioned would not begin construction until the late 1990s under another president's watch, the seeds of today's reality began more than 40 years ago.

#### POPULAR AND BENEVOLENT LEADER

As anyone who knows Father Young can attest, he has many dimensions. To capture the essence of the man, we must include his commitment to his ministry – he is a devoted and charismatic priest. We must note his genuine love for others and his views on the love of benevolence which, in his words, "becomes more real in the doing rather than in the defining." And we cannot leave out his absolute love for his Marianist life. He abides by the Marianist philosophy of living and teaching the qualities of faith, humility and simplicity through service and leadership.

Father Jim always championed collaboration with lay persons and his religious brothers and sisters. As we recall the years of his vice presidency

especially, it was evident that lay faculty were replacing the professed Marianists. His empathy, his warmth and encouragement – a compliment given, time spent over coffee – made him a respected leader among his colleagues as well as other groups. And his seemingly constant cheerfulness and sense of humor made him an exceptionally accessible leader, traits that helped ease the transition of St. Mary's into collaborative lay leadership.

Talking to him now, I am not surprised that he is proud of how far St. Mary's has come. True to form, he quickly points out there are many who deserve credit for past and current accomplishments. When he speaks about others who provided leadership

before and after him, and about the faculty, staff, trustees, alumni and students who were committed to making St. Mary's better, we know it is with sincerity, love and respect. Current faculty and staff who were here during Father Young's presence on campus remember his openness and many kindnesses and reciprocate the feelings he has for them.

#### PRIDE IN THE PAST, HOPE FOR THE FUTURE

When our visit ended late that fall day, I asked Father Jim how he would sum up what he felt about his dreams for St. Mary's. He spoke of how the

campus has grown during his years away from St. Mary's – the presence of new residence halls, the University Center, the renovated buildings on campus and, finally, the construction of the long-awaited and much-needed convocation center – attributing the


growth to the collaboration of many people working together.

He then paused and closed his eyes for a moment. That dazzling smile radiated across his face and he said, "I am so grateful to have been a part of St. Mary's University, and I want people to know that their efforts in helping with the dreams for the future were not in vain, because today we have an even stronger university. I want all of those persons who helped to know how deeply grateful I am to have been a part of it all."



## Year 2000 Countdown to the End?

#### "THE TIMES, THEY ARE A-CHANGIN.' "

The Amazon rain forests, the world's lungs, are drying into a tinderbox. Plankton, the very beginning of the world's food chain, is endangered. Global warming could cause ocean levels to rise 20 feet, submerging major U.S. cities. Earthquakes bury thousands. One genocide follows another: Rwanda, Bosnia, Kosovo, East Timor.

And, we're at the eve of a new millennium. Are these the events the Bible says foretell the imminent end of the world?

#### BIBLICAL PROPHESY AND THE APOCALYPSE

Some Christians think so. Tabloids like the National Enquirer have feasted on a mixture of these events and biblical prophecies. Even the Rev. Billy Graham in his recent book, "Approaching Hoofbeats," says the Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse are upon us. And in Catholic circles, some Marian apparitions and other private revelations have intimated an impending three days of darkness that will envelop the earth. One branch of Christian apocalypticism claims that the world is in such a mess, there's nothing one can do except turn to Christ and expect to be raptured-out soon.

What *does* the Bible say about these contemporary or imminent disasters? The evidence of the New Testament can be puzzling. Jesus' apocalyptic discourse in Matthew, Mark and Luke tells us that in the end, "There will be signs in the sun, the moon and the stars, and on earth nations will be in dismay, perplexed by the roaring of the sea and the waves. People will die of fright . . ." (Luke 21:25-26). "When you see these things happening, know that he is near, at the gates" (Mark 13:29).

On the other hand, the same gospel says, "Of that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father" (Mark 13:29). In Mark, Jesus' predictions are occasioned by his prophecy concerning the destruction of the temple. In the foreground is an imminent historical event, but projected behind it is a cosmic climax that is both terrifying to the world and a source of rejoicing for those faithful to the Lord.

#### GOD'S POWERFUL MESSAGE

How do we make sense of this double affirmation – that there will be signs the end is near, yet not know the day nor the hour? Let's put on the eyeglasses of the biblical writers, who were acutely concerned with the final end of all things, and think the way they did: that life in this world is not ultimately "where it's at"; that God will have his day; and that a just God, who cannot let injustice have the last word, will come in a judgment that will also be salvation.

So how do the cosmic events we experience, and may yet experience, fit into his plan, and what is he trying to tell us about them? Clearly God is not giving us a timetable. He did not give us the Bible to use as a crystal ball. But he does have a powerful message.

To understand how the end can be *not yet*, and at the same time be *at the gates*, we need to distinguish between *chronological* time and *kairos* time.

Chronological time is measured by a clock, or better, by the video camera in a convenience store. It records everything, making no judgment on the value of one moment over another. In chronological time, your autobiography would take you as long to write as you have lived.

There is, however, another kind of time. It's *kairos* time, or time in the sense of a significant moment, like a thief robbing the convenience store. Or, writing your autobiography, you would choose moments that were significant for whole periods or perhaps crucial turning points in your life's journey.

#### REHEARSAL TIME

Among the events that plot out your life in kairos time, there can be one, perhaps more, we could call *rehearsal* time. That's when you meet the *end* in the *middle*. For example, a near death experience can alert you to the meaning and purpose of your life and be the occasion of a real conversion. Your life values are different thereafter.

Some 30 years ago there was an award-winning Japanese movie called "Ikiru" (To Live). It told the story of a man whose 60 years of life had been routine and meaningless, until a doctor told him he had cancer and only six months to live. His life was revolutionized, and he brought meaning to it by building a playground for children. The point of the movie was that he really lived only in the last months of his life, catapulted into that meaning by meeting the end in the middle, in short, by conversion.

And so the New Testament invites us to meet the end of the world, and the second coming of Jesus, in the middle – while we have *time*. It is not talking about chronological time but kairos time. It's talking about *rehearsal* time. That's what Jesus means by his often repeated, "I say to all, 'Watch,' for you know not the day nor the hour."

The real question, then, is what does it mean to watch? Does it mean to look to the sky for signs of the end, for signs of the Second Coming? After Jesus' ascension the angels ask the disciples, "Why are you standing there looking at the sky" (Acts 1:11). It was a way of reminding them what Jesus had told them earlier, "It is not for you to know the times and seasons the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem . . .


and to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:7-8). Jesus directs his disciples to the importance of the *present*.

#### READINESS FOR THE SECOND COMING

What Jesus says in Acts about using the time for evangelizing, he says in different terms in the gospel of Matthew. Jesus relates four parables – the faithful and the unfaithful servant, the 10 bridesmaids, the parable of the talents and, climactically, the scene of the general judgment (the separation of the sheep and the goats) – about what readiness for his coming means. The key point of the parables is to *use* the time and the gifts you've been given *now* and you will be ready *then*.

Even more striking in all of these parables is a common unpreparedness on the part of some. It is their sins not of *commission* (which are not mentioned), but of *omission*, as the last parable makes clear: "As long as you did not do it for one of these, my least brethren, you did not do it for me" (Matthew 25:45).

What is important, then, is not to know what the future holds, but who holds the future. And if we know that, and live accordingly, putting our gifts to good use for the service of the kingdom, we can face the future without fear and with great hope.



The Rev. George Montague, S.M., S.T.D., was ordained a priest in 1958 and received his doctorate in sacred theology in 1960. He began teaching at St. Mary's in 1961

and was appointed full professor in 1971. He moved away to teach and administer Society of Mary programs in Missouri, Canada, India and Ohio before returning to St. Mary's in 1990. Montague co-founded the Catholic Charismatic Bible Institute, now known as Word Afire Catholic Bible Institute, at St. Mary's in 1977. A prolific writer of more than 20 books, his most recent is the timely "The Apocalypse and the Third Millennium."

Goudge became president and CEO in 1998 after joining Broadway National Bank in 1989 as executive vice president-lending division.





He is one of 16 nationwide selected to serve the president as special assistants to Cabinet members and senior White House staff. His one-year stint began Sept. 1, 1999.



#### Castañeda Named To O'Connor Chair



The O'Connor chair was established in 1981 by the O'Connor ranching family of Victoria, three generations of whom have been educated by the Marianists. It is designed to advance scholarly research in Colonial Borderlands history. Selection to the professorship is based on a national competition.

Castañeda, associate professor of history at St. Mary's since 1997, has focused her research, publications and teaching on gender, sexuality and women of color in California and the Spanish-Mexican borderlands from the 1770s to the present. She plans to complete and publish her manuscript on the social and cultural history of indigenous and mestiza (racially mixed) women in colonial Alta California from 1770-1850.

A prize-winning historian,
Castañeda earned her doctorate in U.S.

prestigious national prizes in 1993 and
has been widely anthologized.

#### Teran Receives Award

Lee Teran, law professor, was awarded the second annual Human Rights Defender Award by the Human Rights Documentation Exchange. #### St. Mary's Joins NCAA's Heartland Conference

St. Mary's athletics teams, previously in the NAIA's Heart of Texas Conference, have joined the Heartland Conference in the NCAA Division II. Men's and women's tennis and men's golf are eligible for postseason berths this year, while the remaining seven varsity sports — women's volleyball, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's basketball, softball and baseball — will be eligible beginning next year.

The conference, which also includes the University of the Incarnate Word, St. Edward's University and Texas Wesleyan University in Texas, and Rockhurst University, Drury College and Lincoln University in Missouri, was formed over the summer.

#### Human Rights Focus of Fall President's Peace Commission

The fall edition of the President's Peace Commission, "Human Rights Have No Borders," focused on the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, a document adopted by the United Nations on Dec. 10, 1948.

The commission, founded in 1984 and comprised of students, staff and faculty, serves to create within the University community an awareness of the Roman Catholic perspective as a foundation for directing the dialogue among the broad and varied human and religious enterprises, themselves directed toward peace.

Panel sessions explored origins and foundations of human rights addressed in the U.N. document, including those dealing with nationality, health care, capital punishment, education, movement and residence, community responsibility and catholic social teaching.

America's Catholic bishops approved the document by a 223-31 vote margin on Nov. 17 before sending it to the Vatican for final endorsement. The Texas bishops and Catholic university leaders had reached a consensus prior to the bishops' vote.

Although it is too early to tell how the new rules will operate in practice, St. Mary's administrators enjoy a good working relationship with Archbishop Patrick Flores of the San Antonio Diocese, which they expect to continue.

#### Law School in Top 10

The St. Mary's School of Law has been ranked in the top 10 in the country for Hispanics by Hispanic Business magazine.

The prestigious honor ranks St. Mary's eighth overall behind the University of Texas at Austin, University of New Mexico, University of California at Los Angeles, Loyola Marymount University (California), Georgetown University, University of Southern California and Nova Southeastern University (Florida).



#### Legal Community Celebrates Red Mass



#### Morales-Bissaro Selected to NAIA Hall of Fame

Leticia Morales-Bissaro (B.A. '86) will be inducted into the NAIA Hall of Fame (Athlete Category), the association's highest honor, next spring. The tribute "is in recognition of (her) exemplifying the highest ideals of intercollegiate athletics and fine moral character," according to NAIA national headquarters. She joins former Rattler and NBA star, Robert Reid, and men's basketball coach, Ed Messbarger, who were inducted into the hall in 1986 and 1990 respectively.

Morales-Bissaro played a key role in the University's first NAIA national championship – in women's softball – in 1986. A pitcher with super speed and deadly accuracy, she pitched in every championship tournament game that year. Her tournament records for appearances (8), wins (7), complete games (8) and strikeouts (65) still stand. She also was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player and was named a NAIA All-American in 1985 and 1986.

Morales-Bissaro, associate director of evening studies at St. Mary's, was the first woman inducted into the St. Mary's University Athletics Hall of Fame in 1994. She continues to conduct pitching clinics in the San Antonio community, volunteers in local Catholic Youth Organization sports programs, and is chairwoman of the St. Mary's Athletics



## DEVELOPMENTS

#### Creating a Scholarship at St. Mary's

"There is an old Chinese saying that each generation builds a road for the next. The road has been built well for us, and I believe it is incumbent upon us, in our generation, to build our road for the next generation."

Each year, scholarships provide assistance to hundreds of St. Mary's students. They aid in recruitment and retention of students by supporting those who display academic promise, interest in a certain field of study, and/or financial need.

Two types of scholarships can be established at St. Mary's – expendable and endowed. An expendable scholarship typically is started by a one-time cash gift from which awards are made until the fund is exhausted.

More popular are endowed scholarships because the principal is never touched. Scholarships are awarded in perpetuity from income made on the interest of the principal.

At St. Mary's a minimum of \$25,000 is required to set up an endowed scholarship.

Donors may name the fund in honor or memory of a loved one, family member, special Marianist or friend, or even name the scholarship after themselves.

Donors also may be involved in determining scholarship criteria and designating a school or program through which awards are made.



#### **End of Year Giving**

Please remember that to take advantage of 1999 tax benefits, gifts to St. Mary's University must be postmarked by Dec. 31, 1999. There are a few simple steps involved in establishing a scholarship at St. Mary's:

- ▲ Call or write to the St. Mary's University Development Office. (All contacts between the University and potential donors are confidential.)
- ▲ Determine the type of scholarship you wish to establish. Keep in mind that expendable scholarships are sustained through annual gifts while endowed scholarships are awarded in perpetuity.
- ▲ Determine eligibility requirements and amount of award(s). You may wish to work with a staff member to develop eligibility and selection criteria, such as a preferred academic major and minimum grade point average.
- ▲ Once you have determined the scholarship details, a St. Mary's representative will create a Scholarship Agreement to ensure your wishes for the fund are made clear when the scholarship funds are dispersed.
- ▲ Make your contribution to initiate the scholarship.

St. Mary's will continue to update you about the progress of your scholarship, including an annual report of the scholarship fund balance and the name of student(s) receiving the award(s).

#### \$1.7 Million Gift Underscores Bar Pass Rate Efforts

An anonymous \$1.7 million gift will provide vital resources for the School of Law, in part to help its students improve their chances of passing the state bar exam.

Attorney Jack Paul Leon, who presented the gift on behalf of anonymous donors, said the funds recognize Dean Bill Piatt's leadership and dedication to legal education for the future lawyers of Texas. Leon is a 1959 graduate of the School of Law and past president of the Law Alumni Association.

Of the \$1.7 million, \$750,000 will be used to create an endowed bar loan fund so students can take bar review

courses and be better prepared to pass the bar exam. Students preparing for the state exam are encouraged to take review courses but often lack the financial resources to pay for them.

Last year Piatt created the Academic Excellence Office to support students in completing their classroom education, passing the state bar and becoming successful professionals. In his second year as dean, Piatt has made improving the bar pass rate a top priority for St. Mary's School of Law.

#### **New Program Initiated**

A new program, hopefully to become a tradition, was unveiled Oct. 19. The Senior Class Gift Campaign, a University-sponsored, student-run program, will raise funds to purchase a gift for St. Mary's.

The Senior Class Gift Council is made up of seniors who have volunteered to champion the project. The students want to create a new tradition on campus, leaving a class legacy, while increasing and promoting school spirit. ■

#### St. Mary's Gets \$2.1 Million Grant for Technology

A grant from the U.S. Department of Education – the largest in St. Mary's history – puts technology on the front burner and will offer students and faculty new learning opportunities previously only on wish lists.

The \$2.1 million five-year grant, funded through the Hispanic-Serving Institutions Program Title V provision, is one of the three highest in the nation awarded this year.

The goal of the program is to improve the quality of academic programs through technology-aided teaching and learning, and to enhance student skills and proficiencies with information technologies.

Key provisions of the grant include renovating classrooms, providing faculty training, improving student access to personal computers and laptops, expanding user support, increasing network connections and providing faster Internet access.

#### **Seven Ways** to **Make** a Gift

Or if transferred through a broker, the value is determined on the date of transfer as recorded in the books of the corporation.
- **®** Personal Property-Gifts of tangible personal property such as art, rare books and manuscripts related to St. Mary's purposes, are fully tax deductible at fair market value.
- Real Estate-Real estate can provide an immediate gift, fund a trust, or even arrange for a lifetime occupancy after making the gift.


- **6** Will-A bequest in your will can be an effective way of giving while reducing the taxable portion of your estate.
- @ Life Income Gifts-You can make a substantial gift to St. Mary's and obtain income, estate and gift tax benefits, and/or an income for your family. In general, assets are transferred to a trustee who administers the fund. When the last beneficiary dies, the trust is terminated and the principal transferred to St. Mary's. An investment to benefit you and St. Mary's can be made through a Charitable Remainder Unitrust, a Charitable Gift Annuity or a Deferred Payment Gift Annuity. Each offers tax deductions and other benefits.
- **O Insurance-**Life insurance can benefit St. Mary's at a relatively low cost to you. To qualify, the University must be the owner and beneficiary. If the policy is paid up, your charitable contribution is the cash value of the policy. Premiums paid on a gifted insurance policy also qualify for tax deductions.

#### **Center Under Construction**

We surpassed our \$15 million fund-raising goal for the Athletics Convocation Center in January, celebrated our success in April, and broke ground for the new facility in June. As I write this, the 135,000-square foot building is under construction, dramatically changing the face of our campus.

The center will serve all of our students with its wellness and fitness facilities, space for intramural games, and 3,800-seat venue for varsity men's basketball and women's basketball and volleyball. And, it will allow us to reach out still more to our neighboring community, providing a comfortable environment for summer youth programs and sports camps, and more space for public lectures and performances than is available now. It will pull the campus more toward the interior, bridging the residence hall communities with the University Center, the Alkek Business Building, and the School of Law complex.

Again, a special thanks to Campaign Chairman Bill Greehey (B.B.A. '60), chairman and CEO of Valero Energy Corp., for his dedication and personal leadership in bringing the campaign to its successful conclusion. It's hard to imagine a better and more committed chairman. Thanks as well to the University Advancement team, led by Vice President Thomas B. Galvin, for their long hours and hard work. And thanks especially to you, our alumni and friends, who have made possible this grand addition to the St. Mary's campus!

#### **Grant Funds Technology**

More good news arrived this past summer when we received a \$2.1 million grant from the U.S. Department of Education for educational technology. Years of planning positioned us to be selected for this grant that will make a major difference at St. Mary's. Funding over the next five years includes renovation of 16 University classrooms and training for about 100 faculty members.

Especially exciting is that the grant will allow us to integrate new technologies into our Marianist educational philosophy. So much of what I read in this area focuses on increasing "faculty productivity," which typically means less student-faculty contact. At St. Mary's our challenge will be to find ways to make technology enhance student-faculty interaction. We deeply believe education is an interpersonal activity and more than knowledge is transferred when students and faculty interact in a healthy environment: both students

and teachers grow and develop. We want these advances in technology to strengthen the student-oriented, person-to-person process, not replace it. Thanks in part to the grant, I believe we are in a position to become a national leader in this

#### **New Appointments**

The past year has also seen some transitions in key posts. Katherine M. Sisoian (M.A. '84), an 18-year St. Mary's veteran, was appointed vice president of student development in April, concluding a national search. And, more local talent topped the list of national candidates when Janet B. Dizinno, Ph.D., chairwoman of the psychology department, was chosen to replace the Rev. Charles Miller, S.M., S.T.D., as dean of the School of Humanities and Social Sciences.

Although this is not the venue to recount the achievements of the last 11 years, suffice it to say that I have tremendously enjoyed the opportunity to serve the mission of St. Mary's and the privilege of working with an enormously talented and dedicated community of people – faculty, staff, students, alumni and friends of the University. I am equally confident that the best is yet to come and that the first decade of the new millennium will be one of even greater development of St. Mary's unique Marianist mission.

#### **Solid Future for University**

St. Mary's continues to "grow in wisdom, age and grace." This past year we maintained the high enrollments of the 90s; our graduation rate outpaced our peer institutions; our finances have been very stable, generating a healthy fund balance at the end of the year; our endowment continued to grow thanks to a healthy stock market and to University contributions; and our academic reputation was strengthened among prospective students and our peer institutions as illustrated in national rankings such as U.S. News and World Report.

We continue to develop the strong Catholic and Marianist dimensions of the University, spurred by the Vatican document "Ex corde Ecclesiae" and our own "Characteristics of Marianist Universities" document. And most importantly, we continue to add to the ranks of our alumni new generations of graduates prepared and committed to making the world a better place.

## A NEVER ENDING DEBT by Kathy Khattar Villarreal (B.A. '89, M.A. '96)

ho would spend more than half their life "paying back" an alma mater?

Meet 80-year-old Robert Rosow (B.S.C. '45), a successful certified public accountant and prominent community leader. But what he owes isn't money. In his words, "It's a debt of gratitude to St. Mary's University. Everything I have is attributed to a St. Mary's education, and I want to give until I can give no more."

#### Marianists Humble Heroes


Without the Marianists, a St.
Mary's education is "nothing,"
according to Rosow. He fondly says,
"They're the finest people I know.
Great professors and men like Brother
George Kohnen, the Rev. Stanley
Kusman and Brother Paul Goelz taught
beyond the subjects; they shared
lessons in hard work, determination
and community. I never met a
Marianist I didn't like."

The Marianists' vow of poverty allowed this poor Jewish boy from San Antonio's Southside to attend the University on scholarship in 1937. It was their principles of honor and ethics that made his time at St. Mary's so special.

"The Marianists had a tough life, taking only for their necessities," he says. "In fact, Brother Kohnen's shirt had more patches than shirt. And all the Marianists lived on the third floor of St. Louis Hall — called Cardboard Flats, because of the cardboard boxes they used to separate the rooms."

#### Lifelong Patron

When Rosow graduated, he stayed at St. Mary's to teach accounting for 10 years. When he did move on, he remained active on boards and committees, contributing his time, talent and treasure for many years. He served as Alumni Association president in 1960 and was named the University's distinguished alumnus in 1975. A board of trustee member for



17 years (the maximum), he continues to serve on several committees.

After 23 years in public practice, Rosow sold his business and he and Freida, his wife of 58 years, took up traveling the world. They've been to Africa seven times and Antarctica, their favorite destination, four. Their 30 years of travels took them sailing on a nuclear-powered Russian icebreaker to the North Pole, husky sledding in Greenland, riding the Trans Siberian Railroad and tenting in the Kalahari Desert. A museum-like collection of photographs and treasures fills Rosow's home and office.

#### **Not Slowing Down**

Their last trip was a hot-air balloon ride over Tanzania to celebrate Freida's 80th birthday. "We've had wonderful times and have been very blessed," says Rosow. They have two sons, both St. Mary's graduates, and two grandchildren.

Rosow works today as a consultant, putting in seven-day, 60-hour workweeks. When asked what's next, Rosow, with a wry smile and twinkle in his eye, replies, "I've just signed a 10-year lease on my new office."


Quijano, active in St. Mary's


